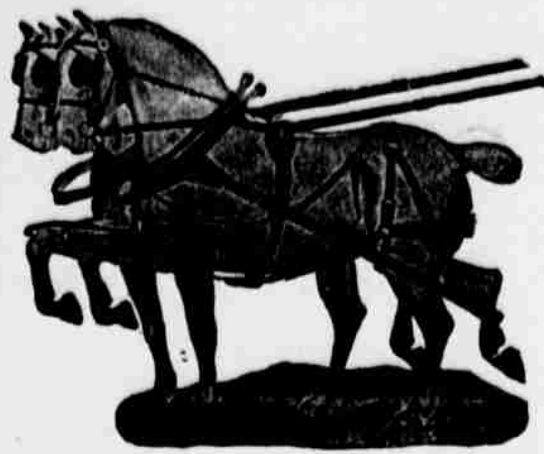

**Are School Taxes Too High?**

There are three local institutions authorized to levy taxes—the county, the city, and the school. In these the county has always levied the full limit allowed by law. So has the city. The school district does not, and has not done so for several years. It is the only one of the taxing institutions that has consistently kept below the legal limit and is entitled to credit instead of abuse for doing so.

Our levy for 1914 is: bond, 5 mills; general, 27 mills. We are 8 mills below the limit.

I have written to a number of other districts of similar situation and size. Some of them are as follows: Superior, 32 mills; Alma 27; McCook, 31; Minden 30; Chadron, 35; Central City, 34; Geneva, 33; Wymora 35.

We are doing as well as other districts and are getting a better school if we have a chance to go ahead. I am not in favor of cutting down the school levy. We need it to develop the schools and ought not to be crippled at this time.
