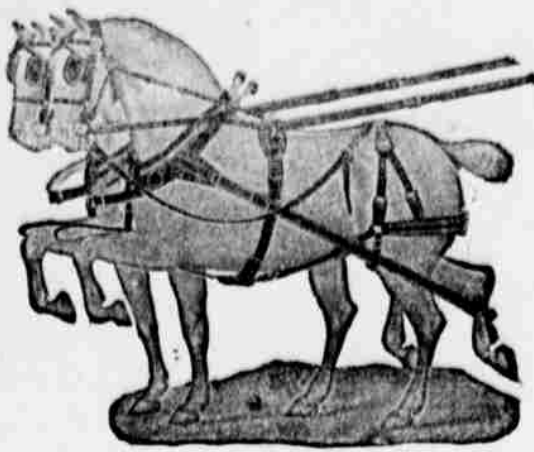

Nebraska Newspaper Boys Honor Oldest Member

The Nebraska Press Association always has something new to offer its members when it meets in Omaha. These innovations have proven quite popular and the one arranged for the meeting, April 19 to 21, will not be any the less popular than those gone before. This year it will be a Pioneer newspaper in its day. April 19, the opening day of the convention, has been designated by the program committee. All the old timers are requested to be present that day. When a handsome token of appreciation will be given by the Association to the man who has been longest in newspaper harness in Nebraska.

Details of the awarding of the token will be announced later by Secretary Johns. In the meantime, all newspaper men in the state who think their service justifies consideration are requested to send their names to Secretary Johns at Grand Island.

Secretary Johns, working with the program committee, is busy arranging the program for the three days. The program will be divided into three sections, and each will be given prominence and will be graced by the leading newspaper men of Nebraska. Iowa and South Dakota editors will be invited to attend the convention and it is quite possible that the College Press Association will meet in Omaha at the same time.

Manure the Best Fertilizer

Data from the Nebraska Experiment Station which were obtained in cooperation with Nebraska farmers in several counties show that the average annual yields of corn from manured fields during a period of three years were 10 bushels greater than from adjoining fields which were not manured. The average annual yields from the unmanured fields were 25.81 bushels an acre and the yield from the manured fields were 36.70 bushels an acre. According to data from other experiment stations the lasting effect of farm manures is at least 20 years; that is to say, a farm may continue to obtain increased annual yields for several years after a good application of farm manure or the turning under of organic matter in some other form. The increases in crop yields for a period of years at several of the best experiment stations were sufficient to give to the manure applied an agricultural value of from \$1 to \$7 a ton, depending upon the climatic conditions, rate of applications, kind of manure, crops manured, etc.

Promising New Hay Crop From Forage Plant

Sudan grass is a very promising forage plant, especially for central and western Nebraska. In the eastern part of the state, however, where alfalfa can be successfully grown, Sudan grass will perhaps never become more than a supplementary crop. For hay it should be sown in rows at the rate of 20 to 30 pounds an acre. The yield is about the same as sorghum.

For feed purposes Sudan grass is sown in rows at the rate of two or three pounds an acre and is cultivated the same as corn. The acre yield of seed is from 700 to 800 pounds.

In feeding value Sudan grass promises to compare favorably with timothy and sorghum. In addition, it produces a more leafy and finer stemmed hay than sorghum.

This new crop is believed to be a relatively drought resistant as can be seen from the Department of Experimental Agronomy, University Farm.
