The new law added nine dollars for non-resident tuition and this will eliminate the agitation as to schooling non-residents below cost. We firmly believe that the great majority of this district desire to maintain the very best school that is possible. We believe that the great majority desire that we accommodate all non-residents that wish to attend our schools.

For several years past the district has spent from one to two thousand dollars each year in additions, excavations and the like and still we have but an old building. Now shall we continue to cut off an inch at a time in order to save pain or shall we amputate at one stroke? The Chief believes that if this district can be bonded for thirty five thousand dollars it should be done and a new high school building suitable to our needs be erected. It will pay in the long run and will immediately solve the problem that confronts the board. We are pursuing the most expensive method that could well be devised and it is high time that we were making a change. We should like to keep up a school that is just as bright as we did in the years that are past. In order to aid the school board in getting information as to the feelings and views of the district we offer the columns of the Chief and will take pleasure in publishing all signed communications touching the question.
