Bill of C. S. Crabill for \$14.50 for team work on farm allowed and warrant ordered drawn for same.
Moved by Cross and seconded by Gilham that the petition to build a new school house in the north part of the District be not granted. Motion carried.
Motion made by Gilham seconded by Cook that a cement walk be built on the west side of the Washington School ground. Motion carried.
On motion Gilham was appointed as a committee of one to dispose of the lumber to the best advantage possible from the old Court House.
In the matter of appointing janitor for the Washington School, ballot was taken and Geo. Hadell received 4 votes, Sherman L. Mr. Hadell was declared elected at a salary of \$50 per month.

In the matter of the Petition for a license to operate Pool Hall in Inavale, Nebraska, running 7 tables, coming on to be heard. It appearing that the license fee having been paid, it was moved and seconded that license be and is hereby granted to operate said hall and County Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed to issue a license to E. C. Gates, to operate a pool hall on lot 15, block 12, Inavale, Nebraska, for 1 year from July 1st, 1915 to July 1st, 1916. Motion carried.
In the matter of sealed bids for the building of bridges as filed by the Omaha Structural Steel Co. of Omaha, Nebraska, the Elkhart Bridge Co., of Indiana, and the Standard Bridge Co., of Omaha, Neb. Now coming on for investigation, on motion said bids were opened and after a careful comparison of said bids, it was moved and seconded that the five bridges advertised for be and is bought of the Omaha Structural Steel Co., on their bid, with the understanding that any bridges of like type will be furnished for the same prices when haul does not exceed haul or these bridges.
