Report of Grant Christy serving notice on lot owners for side walks, read and ordered placed on file.

H. Dedrich, secretary, and J. O. Butler, chief of volunteer fire department, were present to close up the new building proposition and arrange for financial settlement. Moved by Perry and seconded by Caldwell that the mayor and clerk be instructed to approve the claim of C. J. Platt for \$270, when the fire department make certain corrections in deed and contract. Carried.

Floyd Turnure, on behalf of the Red Cloud band, asks for an appropriation of \$50.00 for support of band. Allowed.

Moved by Kootz, seconded by Perry, that city clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for a side walk opposite intersection First Avenue on west side of Walnut Street, owned by C. J. Platt. Carried.

Moved by Perry and seconded by Kootz that the clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for side walk on south side lot 24, blk 22, Smith and Moore addition owned by A. W. Holmgren. Yeas, Perry, Kootz and Saladen. Nays, Caldwell. Carried.
