County Treasurer Issues Distress Warrants

County Treasurer C. D. Robinson this week issued a large number of distress warrants and placed them in the hands of Sheriff O. D. Hedge for collection. A distress warrant requires the sheriff to seize any personal property belonging to a person in arrears for personal taxes and sell the same to pay such taxes. Such warrants are being issued against all persons found to be to any extent in arrears and thus far it has been found unnecessary to take any property. It is found that negligence is the cause for most people being behind and it is also found that practically all know that they must pay or their property will be taken. If people are disposed to be reasonable harsh measures are not resorted to and those who cannot pay at once, all that they owe are allowed to arrange for payments. Good faith is all that is insisted upon. The law makes the treasurer personally responsible for all personal taxes charged against him and it also makes the sheriff personally responsible for all distress warrants placed in his hands.

The Playground and Recreation Association of America has adopted the following as standards which every girl ought to be able to attain:

First test—
Potato race, 142 yards, 42 seconds.
Basket ball throwing, 3 goals, 6 trials
Balancing, 24 feet, 2 trials.

Second test—
Potato race, 140 yards, 39 seconds.
Basket ball throwing, 3 goals, 6 trials
Balancing with bean bag on head, 21 feet, 2 trials.

There are no height, weight or age limits to this test. There shall be but one trial in each event, except the balancing, in which two trials are allowed. It is necessary to qualify in all three events in either class in order to win a badge. No girl is permitted to receive more than one badge in any one year. The third test has not yet been determined.

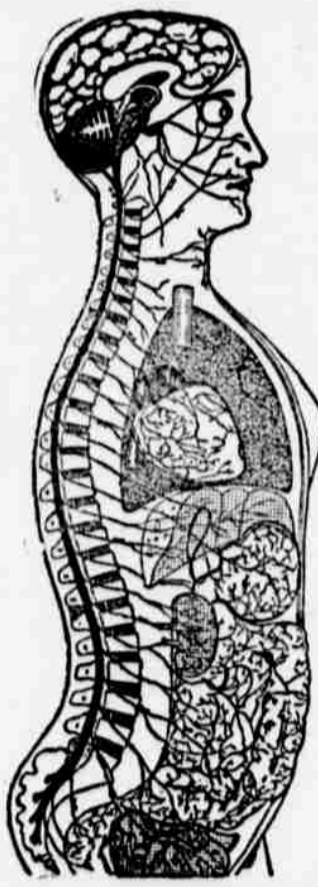
