Lincoln Letter

Attorney General Reed is in Washington representing the state at the rate hearing. Governor Morehead has been in demand the past few weeks in addressing county fairs throughout the state. The fair season is now practically over.

The bond department of State Auditor Smith's office has been having many bonds to register during the past three months. A large number of cities and villages have voted electric lighting bonds and an average of nearly one issue of school bonds per day have been registered, besides many other kinds of bonds. Most of the school bonds are issued in the western part of the state and indicate that a new school house is being built every day in Nebraska at the present time.

As the last legislature made no provision for the expense of organizing an aviation corps in connection with the national guard, Adjutant General P. L. Hall has adopted an original plan for developing this branch of the service. He considers this a very important department of the guard, but is not sure that the people of the state would be in harmony with such a move, if the state were compelled to pay the expenses of the organization. However, the formation of an aeronautical corps has been authorized, and it is proposed to make it self-sustaining by giving public exhibitions of maneuvers and charging a small gate fee, the receipts to go toward paying the expense of the operation. Through the cooperation of the Aero Club of America, Mr. McMillin, a well known aviator, has tendered his machine and services to the national guard of the state. During the past month the members of the corps have been devoting their time to the study and perfection of the crops at their own expense. Captain C. W. Shaffer who is the principal promoter of the movement, was formerly one of the instructors at the Curtis School of Aviation, at San Diego, California. The plan is to awaken interest in this branch of the national guard service and to demonstrate how important a factor it is in this connection.

State Auditor Smith has compiled a statement based on the 1914 assessment showing the total amount of taxes levied in the state for all purposes. The amount of the levy is \$21,465,457. About one-sixth of this sum is collected for the support of the state and its institutions. The balance is applied on county, municipal, school, precinct, road district or special assessment purposes. One-half of all the taxes assessed in the state goes for educational purposes, including the support of the state university, normal, city, village and rural schools. For 1915 the total amount apportioned to each county will be considerably lessened on account of the action of the state board of equalization at a recent meeting in cutting the assessment about \$180,000 for this year.

Time To Plant Bulbs

It is advisable to plant bulbs as early as they appear in the market. Well rotted manure should be spread over the flower beds and spaded into the soil after they have first been cleared of rubbish.

Tulips and hyacinths are the best flowers for formal effects. Iris looks well when planted in masses. Plant the narcissus and jonquil in the shrubbery and hardy flower beds. The following planting table is one recommended by the landscape gardener at the University Farm: Crocus and snowdrop, two inches deep and two inches apart; jonquil and narcissus, four inches deep and six inches apart; tulip, four to six inches deep and four inches apart; hyacinth, five inches deep and five inches apart; lily, six or seven inches deep and a foot or more apart.
