City Council Meets

The city council met on Tuesday evening, Mayor Damerell presiding. All of the Councilmen were present. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

James Peterson and Frank Smith appeared before the council and asked permission to construct a building at the intersection of 4th avenue and Webster street for the purpose of exhibiting the prize automobile to be given away by the merchants of Red Cloud. The council granted them a permit to erect the same.

The report of S. R. Florence, City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file.

Hutchinson & Saladen presented a policy for \$10,000 on Boiler Insurance for three years and a policy covering liabilities to employees for one year. Boiler policy to cost \$80.50 and Liability policy to cost \$128.56. Moved by Perry and seconded by Koontz that we accept the Liability Policy for \$128.56 the same to be paid for at the January meeting and reject the Boiler Policy. Motion carried.

The Mayor notified the Council that the City had been sued for \$5000 by Spencer E. Bailey and asked Council to express themselves concerning an attorney. Moved by Perry and seconded by Caldwell that the matter be referred to the advisory committee to procure an attorney to represent the city. Motion carried.
