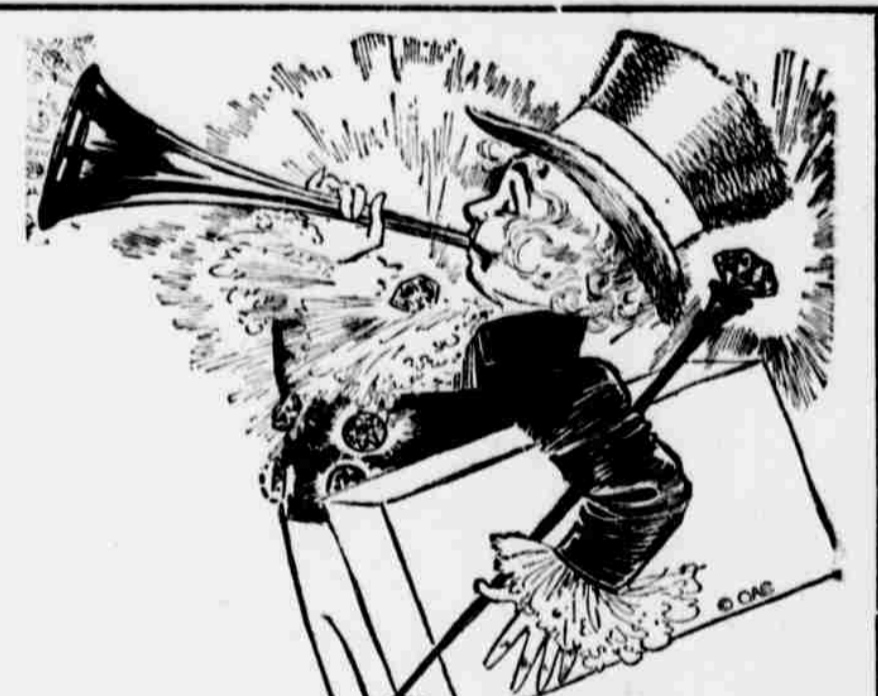

Congressman A. C. Shallenberger has introduced the following bill in the House of Representatives which has been referred to the Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds:

"Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and is hereby, authorized and directed to acquire, by purchase, condemnation or otherwise, a site, on which at some future time there shall be erected a post-office building, at Red Cloud, Nebraska, and the appropriation therefor shall not exceed the sum of \$15,000."
