MAN WALKS IN AT HIS OWN FUNERAL

Cincinnati.—Edward Riley of Detroit walked into the home of his sister, Mrs. Charles Becker, in East Fifth street, the other day and put a stop to his own funeral.

His weeping relatives at first stared. Then followed embraces, and the body of a man killed in an automobile accident in Detroit and sent here as that of Riley was removed to an undertaker's parlors.

Riley declares that the stranger whose burial as his came so near happening was Fred Ellis, a derelict, to whom he gave an old coat not long ago. At Detroit, according to the police, Mrs. Becker and her husband both recently identified the remains

of the man, and on this identification a check for \$1,500 from an insurance company was presented at the Becker home here in payment of their loss. However, the real Mr. Riley refused to let his sister cash the check.

The Wayne county coroner at Detroit directed the disposition of the body that was turned aside.

The presence of the two postcards from Mrs. Becker to Riley found in the coat, it is said, explained Riley's story.

ARRESTED AT PRISON GATE

Convict Caught Twice at Leavenworth, Kan., as He Finished Terms.

Leavenworth, Kan.—George Roberts, alias Pete Miller, alias Frank Hardy, has had trouble "passing the gate" at the federal penitentiary. He was brought here the first time to serve a three-year term on the charge of robbing a post office in Nebraska.

When about to pass out at the end of his term he was arrested and taken to Iowa on the charge of robbing a post office in that state. He pleaded guilty promptly and received another sentence of one year, which he finished recently.

Roberts was bidding his comrades farewell at the gate when Deputy United States Marshal J. M. Meyers arrested him again. He is now held awaiting the coming of government officials to take him away for another trial on the charge of robbing the post office at Pine Bluff, Ill. He is only twenty-seven years old.

CHASED HOME BY PANTHER

Missouri Farmer's Wife Has Terrifying Experience and Narrow Escape From Death.

Gainesville, Mo.—Screams of a panther a few nights ago sent the cold chills creeping up the person of Francis Holland, aged cattleman and sent the coon dogs home with their tails invisible, shivering with fright. It was the first panther heard in Ozark county in four years. The animal is believed to be in the vicinity of "Bear Caves," eleven miles southeast of here.

Recently, a panther visited this part of the country. Mrs. Noah Webb wife of a farmer living near Mammoth, had a narrow escape from death. The cat followed her half a mile and, as she reached her gate charged. She got into the house before the panther closed in.

Murray, Ky.—A can containing \$300 in gold was uprooted from the ground by a hog on the farm of Bud Ray, near Jones' Mill, in Henry county, Tenn. Mrs. Collins says her husband once owned the farm on which the money was found, and that she loaned him the amount contained in the can shortly before his death. After his death, she says, the money could not be found, although his books contained a record reading: "Three hundred dollars canned."

INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

By E. O. SELLERS, Acting Director of Sunday School Course of the Moody Bible Institute, Chicago.

LESSON FOR MARCH 26

REVIEW—THE GREAT MULTITUDE.

READING LESSON—Revelation 7:9-17. GOLDEN TEXT—They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; neither shall the sun strike upon them, nor any heat; for the Lamb that is in the midst of the throne shall be their shepherd, and shall guide them unto fountains of waters of life; and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes.—Rev. 7:16, 17.

I. General Information.—Omitting lessons 4, 7 and 11, all of the past quarter's work has to do with the early, the apostolic church, covering a period of time from A. D. 30 to perhaps A. D. 37, six or seven years. The chief events are the resurrection of Jesus, the coming of the Holy Spirit, the change in the apostles, particularly Peter, the conversion and baptism of 2,000 believers, fellowship and wonders worked among these believers, the beginning of persecution, the selection of seven deacons, Stephen's testimony and death, the dispersion of the Christians, the work of Philip, great growth in the early church.

Historically these lessons have to do with the things that Jesus began and continued to do after his resurrection through the power of the Holy Spirit. It is, therefore, a story of the power of the risen Christ. The principal characters are of two classes. (1) The leading workers. Of these are: Peter and John, apostles; the 120 disciples, Barnabas, the seven deacons, particularly Stephen and Philip; the Ethiopian eunuch and Gamaliel, who gave some friendly assistance. (2) The chief enemies: Those who falsely accused the apostles, the rulers of the Jews and the temple, Ananias and Sapphira, Saul and Simon Magnus.

It is not difficult to paint a word picture of the events of the past quarter. This may be done by assigning to separate pupils such questions as: Where, when and why did the event of this lesson occur? To another pupil assign the task of telling what he thinks the scene looked like, and to still another to name the chief persons mentioned in each lesson. Let these assignments omit lessons 4, 7 and 11, which do not chronologically fit into the work of this quarter. The remaining pupils should be primed to supply any omitted facts and to correct any mistakes.

I. The Coming of Power. Lesson 1. The ascension of Jesus is one that shows us the risen Christ as the giver of the Holy Spirit and he is the All-Powerful One who has carried forward the things Jesus "began to do." Lesson 2. This is very much the same except that it suggests the man side of this transaction. As the early disciples obeyed, they received. In like manner the Spirit is given today to those that "ask him." Lesson 3 shows what effect we may anticipate when we proclaim the fact of the risen Christ.

II. The Use of Power. Lesson 5 (omitting No. 4) has to do with the daily walk and work of those who had so recently received this newly bestowed power. Through his servants, Jesus, by the power of the Spirit, heals and makes strong the lame man at the temple gate—a case of "applied Christianity," the power of practical social service. As a result of this service Peter and John (Lesson 6) had opportunity to give their testimony to the rulers, the result of which confounded the enemies who thought they had conquered Christ at Calvary—the use of power in testimony. The further evidence of how this new power was using men is that given in lesson 8, the Christian Brotherhood at Jerusalem.

III. The Test of Power. Stephen (Lesson 10) was one of those who had been separated for the care of the temporal affairs of the early church, yet his testimony and martyrdom easily makes him more famous than most of the apostles and forever exalts the layman in the Christian church.

One other (Lesson 12) of those seven deacons, Philip, was also so signally used and blessed that his name and deeds are almost as familiar to us as is the work of Stephen.

In the first case this newly bestowed power filled the witness with a calmness and courage that will always remain an inspiration, while in the second illustration Philip so gave himself to the direction and leadership of the Spirit as to go where he was sent; and when to human judgment his presence was essential to the carrying on of a great revival, he obeyed the new command and left the multitude to deal with a single individual.

Jesus makes no reference to the "mass consciousness" and the Holy Spirit's power receives no greater or more far-reaching test than that which had to do with its dealings with the individual soul.

Each teacher should see to it that each scholar shall read these eight chapters several times, if possible, before the review occurs, in order that they may see the quarter's work as a whole, for it is indeed one story: the story of the risen Christ winning men to himself and equipping them to go forth in obedience to his last great command (Luke 24:46-49; Acts 1:8.)

Synthetic Eggs.

An Austrian scientist of Graz is said to have been making synthetic eggs. He has been able to extract the albumen contained in the blood of bullocks, sheep, pigs, and other animals slaughtered for human consumption, and to present it in such a form that it has no trace of its origin, either in taste or smell. As prepared by his system, it is a coarse, yellow powder to which he has given the name of haematabil. His process has already been applied in a number of German and Austrian abattoirs, and haematabil is in use in many hospitals of the Central empires as a substitute for eggs. It dissolves in water, and can also be used in the preparation of pastry and other dishes.
