Kansas City Market

Kansas City Stock Yards, May 22 1916.—Cattle prices advanced around 25 cents last week, and closed firm. The supply today is 10,000 head, same as on last Monday, and strong con-ditions are again effective. In addifrom Broken Bow, Nebraska, which made the 370 mile run in 22 hours, contained steers at \$9.65 and \$9.85 the latter price top for the day. Colorado pulp fed steers were not as unmerous as on recent Mondays, most of onger anything that can be called 89.40 today, a record price, and Montana barley fed steers brought \$9.20, highest price on record for Montanas by 45 cents. Quarantine receipts amount to scarcely anything. North Texas feeders observing with pleasure the trend of the market with ref-Oklahoma grassers not yet ready. Stockersand feeders held up strong week with almost a complete recovery from the break early in the week, but a good run at leading markets today sent prices down again, supply here 15,000. However, order buyers bought some hogs here early at steady prices, top, \$9.90, but bulk of sales at \$9.60 to \$9.80, ranges 5 to 10 lower. The supply last week was 15,000 head more than previous week, but packers acted like it was a boon and not a hardship, which points to the extraordinary capacity of consumptive channels, and incidentally offeres incouragement as regards future mar-kets. Sheep and lambs sold stronger very day last week, and are firm today, some sales higher, fat goats a quarter higher. No fancy wooled lambs are offered today, but same are worth around \$12.50. Clipped Westerns weighing 88 lbs, brought \$10.75, a new high record, and native spring lambs, medium class, sold at \$12.25. Texas wethers of second grade bro't \$8.50, choice ones worth \$8.75 or more, Arizona clipped yearlings to-day at \$9.10, 88 lb. average.

Purchase New Engine.

Last week the city council held a special meeting, the purpose of which was to reach a decision on the matter of purchasing a new engine, to be used to develope power for the pumps and electric generator in the muncipal power plant. The Pneumatic Tool Co. had their representtive present at the meeting, and he gave a detailed explanation of the workings of the en gine, and sold it to them under a guarantee that it would save the city \$200 a month or more, in fuel. It being the first engine of this class in this section, very liberal terms were secured. It is to be operated in connection with the steam engine now used in the plant, and will furnish power during eighteen hours of the day or may be used in conjunction with the steam engine during the bours in which they have the heavy load It will be housed in an addition to the present building. A fifteen thousand gallon concrete fuel oil tank will also be constructed. Supt. Zeigler is of the opinion that the engine will be installed and in oreration not later than July first
