The securing of Helen Keller and Mrs. Macy for a joint lecture on our Chautauqua program gives us one of the greatest headliners in the entire Chautauqua field. This attraction has been secured without one cent of extra cost to our committee or to any season ticket holder. This is certainly a fine recommendation for the circuit chautauqua idea. If our committee had been compelled to buy this attraction it would have cost them several hundred dollars to add this big number to our program and, in fact, they would not have been able to secure it at all at any price. Although she labored under such difficulties, she wrote her first book while in college—"The Story of My Life"—which has since been translated in 15 different languages. Since then she has written several other books, her last one being "Out of the Darkness." Others are: "The World I Live In"; "The Song of the Stone Wall"; "Optimism"—think of that—a word of optimism, as she expressed it, "out of the darkness to those who sit in the light."

Mrs. Macy, her teacher, is almost as great a marvel as Miss Keller herself, for had it not been for the patience and skill of Mrs. Macy, who was formerly Anne M. Sullivan, the achievements of Miss Keller would have been almost impossible. For 26 years Mrs. Macy has been Helen Keller's teacher and nearly constant companion and as they have not been separated during these years so they are not separated on the platform. Mrs. Macy will first tell how she unlocked Helen's mind; how words came one by one; and how finally the barrier to the outside world was passed, when the whole system of finger-spelling one day dawned on Helen Keller's mind. These explanations are of profound interest. Then, Miss Keller is introduced and by her teacher's side gives her message. At the close of the message Miss Keller will answer questions from the audience, transmitted to her by her teacher. To many, this has been the most interesting part of the lecture for it demonstrates the acuteness and keenness of her mind.
