NOTICE OF SPECIAL  
BOND ELECTION

## SEWERAGE BOND PROPOSITION

Notice is hereby given to the electors of the city of Red Cloud, Webster County, Nebraska, that pursuant to a resolution adopted by the mayor and council of said city at a regular adjourned meeting thereof July 25th, 1916, by which resolution said mayor and council determined upon and approved and accepted a system of proposed sewerage and an estimate of the cost thereof in the sum of \$500.00 as submitted by Grant & Fulton of Lincoln, Nebraska, the special engineers selected by said council for that purpose, the plans and specifications and the estimate of the cost to be used now on file in the office of the city clerk, O. G. Teel, subject to public inspection, that a special election is hereby called and will be held in said city at the regular voting places therein, towns in the districts in the office of the city water and light superintendent and in the second ward of the Firemen's Hall, on the 29th day of August, 1916 between the hours of 8 o'clock A. M. and 12 o'clock P. M. at which time and place the following proposition will be submitted to be voted upon:

"Shall the Mayor and City Council of the city of Red Cloud, Nebraska be authorized to issue couple bonds of said city in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, to be denominated sewer bonds of said city of Red Cloud, Nebraska, in denominations of \$500.00 each, payable to bearer and to become due 20 years after the date thereof but payable at any time after the expiration of 5 years at the option of said city, and bearing not to exceed five per cent annual interest and to be dated day of their issuance, interest and principal payable at the office of the treasurer of the state of Nebraska. Said bonds to be sold at not less than par value with accrued interest and the proceeds thereof used by said city for the construction and establishing of a system of sewerage in and for said city in accordance with the plans and specifications above mentioned and at a cost not to exceed \$1000.00. Said system not to include any lateral or district sewer. Shall the mayor and council of said city annually levy the necessary tax upon all the taxable property within said city, in addition to all other taxes to pay the interest upon said bonds as the same becomes due and to furnish a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of said bonds and also an annual tax not to exceed two mills on the dollar for the purpose of maintaining and repairing said system of sewerage?"

The form of the ballot to be used at said election shall be as follows:

Vote for one  
For sewerage bonds and taxes.....

Against sewerage bonds and taxes.....

to be voted and marked by making a cross in the space provided in the usual manner as provided by law.

Should the majority of the votes cast at said election be in favor of said proposition the mayor and council of said city will be authorized to issue and negotiate said bonds according to the conditions and for the purposes above specified and as also contained in the statutes of Nebraska.

The proceeds of said bonds to constitute a separate fund to be used for no other purpose than the installation of said sewer system and said Mayor and Council to be limited to said \$1000.00 in the installation thereof.

Removing Mildew Stains.

Soaking mildew stains in buttermilk or sour milk will many times remove them, but not always. Try a solution of one heaping teaspoonful of chloride of lime to a quart of soft water; strain, when well dissolved, and dip the mildewed spots in it until the stains disappear, then rinse immediately and thoroughly in clear water.
