Sues Red Cloud Citizens for \$25,000

Earl Boyd Smith has brought suit in district court against J. H. Bailey, C. J. Platt, R. W. Krontz, W. A. Sherwood, F. W. Cowden, J. W. Auld, O. C. Teel, Fred Maurer and half a dozen other citizens of Red Cloud, asking damages in the sum of \$25,000.

It is alleged by the plaintiff that in June, 1911, the water supply of the city of Red Cloud being deficient to the extent of 350,000 gallons per day, he and his partner, N. A. Nilson, entered into a contract with the defendants to sink wells and put in machinery and to pump the required amount of water into the city's water system. For this service they were to receive \$1 per day as long as the water was supplied, the defendants having the privilege of purchasing the system for \$3,000 the payments to terminate at any time such purchase was made.
