**Two More Answer Law's Call**

The ever vigilant eye of our county and city officers has brought before the tribunal of justice two more citizens who have not seen fit to obey the laws.

On Wednesday, Officer Boner brought before Police Judge J. A. Burden, Mr. Dan Pumroy, of Riverton, and the Judge relieved him of about five dollars of his cash, the fine being one dollar and costs. Despite the fact that the authorities have notified all auto owners, thru the columns of the local papers that they were compelled to cash up for a 1917 license several autoists have not seen fit to comply with this law, among this number being Mr. Pumroy. Mr. Boner states that in the future he is going to see that this and the speed law is complied with.

County Judge Ranney will also be at home to some of his friends today, having been called upon to preside over the case of the State of Nebraska vs. Ross Barnes.
