work of this project, no matter how great or how small the yield of corn may be, receives a Certificate of Achievement, which may be accepted in lieu of school work. Besides this. the youngster who wins the championship of his county (this applies to 50. counties only) receives a free trip to the State Club Congress. Further information may be had upon application to the Extension Service, University Farm, Lincoln.
