An Ordinance Creating Paving District No. 1 of the City of Red Cloud, Ne. braska, Defining the Limits Thereof and Designating the Property to be Benefitted, Establishing the Width of Roadway to be Paved, Providing for Curbing and Guttering, Providing for Plans, Specifications and Estimates of Cost and for Securing Bids for Owing to the death of Mrs. Clutter the Construction of the Work to be Done, Providing for the Cost of all Construction Work and Other Expenses Incidental Thereto and Repealing all Ordinances and Parts

> BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Red Cloud, Ne-

SECTION 4. That plans, specifications and stimate of cost of work to be done within said paving district shall be secured by the City Council, and that following the completion of this engineering work, bids for the construction of work to be done in said paving district be obtained by advertisement as

equired by law. SECTION 5. That the cost of grading, curbng, guttering and paying the street inter-sections and returns within said district. including all expenses incidental thereto, shall so paid for by the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska: and that the cost of grading, curbing. guttering and the paving of the street within said district, including the expenses incidental to said improvement shall be assessed against the property benefitted in said districtin proportion to the benefits accruing to said property, not exceeding the cost

thereof. SECTION 6. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be, and the same are hereby, repealed. SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take

effect and be in force from and after its pass'


