GOD'S GRACIOUS INVITATION.

LESSON TEXT—Isaiah 55:1-11. GOLDEN TEXT—Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near.—Isa. 55:6.

(1) Who is invited? The word "Ho" is perhaps an abbreviation of the word "Hold," used to excite attention.

(2) Who Will Come? (v. 3). Only those who are listening and who are attentive. Many fail of eternal life because they do not pay attention to the claims of religion.

(3) When to Come (v. 6). While he may be found, and while he is near, implying a time when he may not be found and a time when he will not be near.

Lobbyists Fail to Report

Two dozen men and four women who enrolled as lobbyists during the last session of the Nebraska legislature have failed to make the reports required of them within sixty days following adjournment and have therefore subjected themselves to prosecution under the state anti-lobby law.

Secretary of State Pool has certified the names of all these persons to the attorney general's office, accompanied with the information that they have not obeyed the law.

The non-reporting lobbyists are liable, in case of conviction, to extreme penalties of one year's imprisonment in jail or the penitentiary, or a fine of \$1,000, or both.

Cannot Act at Present.

The Nebraska state council of defense can not act at the present time take steps to suppress demonstrations in Nebraska by alleged members of the Industrial Workers of the World.

Returns From Washington

Governor Keith Neville has returned from Washington and upon his arrival officially announced that he had appointed General George H. Harries of Omaha to be brigadier general and Adjutant General Phil L. Hall, Jr., to be colonel of the Sixth Nebraska regiment.

All of the three members of the Nebraska supreme court commission have been reappointed by the court for terms of two years beginning September 15, under the act of the last legislature extending the life of the commission by that period.
