funds for Webster county as apportioned in said House Roll 722 to construct the following roads beginning at the North East corner of section 3, township 4, range 10, thence south on section line to the southeast corner of said section 3 thence west on the section line to a point about 100 rods west of the northeast corner of section 9, said township and range, thence south 100 rods (Blue Hill), thence east 10 rods to the section line, then south on the section line to a point about 80 rods south of the northeast corner of section 4, township 2, range 10 (Cowles), thence west to the west section line of said section 4, thence north 80 rods to the northeast corner of section 5, township 2, range 10, thence west on the section line to the northwest corner of section 1, township 2, range 11, thence south on the section line to the southeast corner of section 33, township 2, range 11, (Red Cloud).

Beginning at the southwest corner of section 31, township 2, range 12, thence east on the section line through Inavale and Red Cloud also Amboy to the northeast corner of section 1, township 1, range 10, thence south on the section line to the southwest corner of section 6, township 1, range 9, thence east on the section line about 200 rods, with jog to the north 40 rods thence about 80 rods east, thence 40 rods south to the south section line of said section 6, thence east on the section line to the south east corner of section 4, township 1, range 9, (Guide Rock).

For and in consideration of the above special roads being constructed with Federal and State Funds, the Board of County Commissioners of Webster county, hereby pledge the good faith and credit of the county of Webster Nebraska to furnish all of the right of way on the above designated roads free of cost to the Federal Government and State of Nebraska to provide funds for and to properly and continuously maintain the above specified roads after the construction of same, as provided in the above mentioned acts. We also pledge said County of Webster to construct and maintain all bridges on the above specified roads where the clear water way exceeds 30 square feet and within 30 days after the above described roads have been completed we agree to designate same as County Roads as provided in House Roll 212 passed by the 1917 Legislature of Nebraska.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of the County of Webster, Nebraska, this 28th day of August 1917.

Floyd McCall was chosen by the Board to act as Highway Commissioner until the first regular meeting of the Board in January 1918.

A petition was presented and signed by the Board to pave the street east of the Court House.

On motion it was decided to allow all bridge claims possible. The local firms to receive warrants for all their claims up to April 1, 1917. The foreign firms to receive warrants for all claims up to Jan. 1, 1917 except \$11,500 due the Omaha Structural Steel Bridge Co., for 1916 bridges.
