Nebraska is one of the five states in the Union which has no floating debt, the other states being Iowa, Kansas, South Dakota and West Virginia, as shown by the report just issued by the department of commerce, covering the financial investigations for the year 1916. The same report shows that the per capita cost of running the Nebraska state government was \$3.31. The expenditure of Nebraska for national guard and armories was four cents for each person in the state last year. School expenditures in Nebraska amounted to \$1.63 per capita. Conservation of health and prevention of disease drew six cents from each Nebraskan.

Woman's Council of Defense for Webster County Organized

At a meeting of the various women's organizations and societies held Saturday afternoon, September 15th, a Women's Committee of Council of Defense for the city of Red Cloud was formed and which committee elected the following officers:

Mrs. Frank Smith, temporary chairman, was elected permanent chairman; Mrs. Alfred McCall, vice chairman; Mrs. D. H. Kaley, honorary chairman; Edith L. McKeighan, secretary; Mrs. C. D. Robinson, treasurer.

The work is under seven departments, heads of which were appointed by the county chairman as follows:

Chairman of Registration, Anna B. Spanogle; Food Conservation, Gertrude L. Coon; Child Welfare, Mrs. Alfred McCall; Home and Foreign Relief, Mrs. W. A. Sherwood; Safeguarding of Moral and Spiritual Forces, Mrs. F. Henderson; Naturalization, Mrs. O. C. Teel; Publicity, Edith L. McKeighan.

Date of registration for Webster county has been set for September 29th, 1917, and a chairman for each precinct selected.

Mrs. A. Nesbit, member of the State Council of Defense, gave a short but instructive address in which she urged that every woman in Webster county show her loyalty to the government by registering.

Registration is voluntary, not compulsory. The object of this registration is that the government may be advised as to the available number of women who, in case of emergency, will volunteer for home and foreign Red Cross work and those who are willing to take clerical positions in the various departments of government.

It is further to impress upon every woman that she can aid in this war by her efforts in food conservation and otherwise, and her registration is a pledge of her willingness and desire to do this.

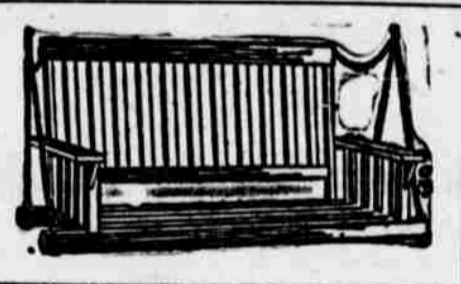
