It is hoped that boys and girls from all over the county will show their pigs at the County Fair.

Senator Penrose, republican, of Pennsylvania, is a little overly fond of criticizing the administration. He recently gave utterance to the following sentiment: "Let sugar go to thirty cents and the consumption will automatically control itself." Doubtless it would, and the Chief respectfully calls attention to the fact that if the esteemed Honorable and some more of his stripe were to get in control and put the "automatic" theory into practice, the man of wealth could roll in sugar and the poor man would have his supply "automatically" shut off. We stand for Hooverizing.

How is your "sweet tooth" getting on these days? The orders for conservation are to be enforced very strictly. The penalty for disregard thereof is severe. 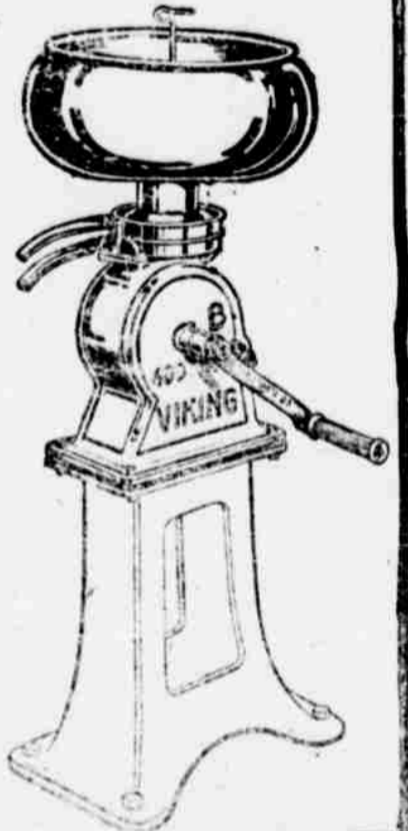
