There will be two premiums 1st, \$1.50 and 2nd, \$.75, on the best trio of all standard varieties of Poultry. Trio consists of one male and 2 females.

Entry fee \$.25 per trio. Regulation coops will be furnished by the institute. Entry blanks will be mailed on application to the Superintendent of Poultry. No charge for blanks, leg bands and feed. Any bird showing symptoms of disease when received or during the exhibition will be removed at once.

All birds will be scored by the judge according to the American Standard of perfection.

Sweepstake ribbon to highest scoring trio of chickens.

In computing for Sweepstakes ribbon, white birds are handicapped 2 points, black 1 1/2 points and buff 1 point over parti-colored.
