

#### PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 5th, A.D.

A JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section one (1) of Article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section One of Ar-Unite Soven of the Constitution of the State of Nebrusian be und the same in this is successful by striking out the following words:

"Borond Persons of Feetin birth was shall have desired their intention to Species consistently to the laws of the United States, on the subject of estimalization, at least thirty days prior to un election. And inserting in the place of the words so stricken, the following

"Second. Persons of foreign birth who shall have become elligens of the United States by naturalication or otherwise conformably to the laws of the United States at least thirty days prior to an election.

Sec. 2. That at the general elec-tion nineteen hundred and eighteen (1918) there shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection the forgating proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage. At such election, on the ballot of each elector voting for or against said proposed amendment, shall be written or printed the words: "For proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage," and "Against said proposed amendment to the constitution relating to the right of suffrage."

Sec. 3. If such amendment shall be approved by a majority of all electors voting at such election, said amendment shall constitute Feetier One (1) Article Savan (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska. Approved, April 9, 1918.
