By orner of the Pestmaster General of the United States the following schedule for service connection and move charges was made effec-September 1st, 1918, Service Connection Charges-



location to another on the same premises.... Actual cost of labor and materials

Service connection charges shall apply to each class of service and class of eq ipment for which there is a regular separate established rate, with the exception of extension bells, push buttons, buzzers, directory listing, and miscellaneous equipment of like character. Service connection charges and move charges shall be collected from all applicants for new or additional service at the time of application and before such new or additional service is established.

Subscribers desiring telephone moved or a change in class of service or equipment should call at office or call Local Manager, at least FIVE DAYS in advance of the date on which it is desired the change be made.
