

facture of Pop. They closed last fall owing to sugar shortage, preferring to close their plant rather than use substitutes in the

This week they put their product out to the trade at 75 cents per case, making it possible for the dealers to again resume the sale of 5 cent Pop. During the time they were closed Pop retailed at 8 cents per bottle.
