NEBRASKA INCIDENTS BOILED TO A FEW LINES
 Occurrences Over the Cornhusker State Chronicled in Paragraph Form for the Busy Reader.

A committee of 100 is being formed by progressive forces of the state to take charge of the movement which it is hoped will result in the election of broad-minded, far-seeing men to the constitutional convention. At a preliminary meeting of men interested held at Lincoln some days ago a tentative organization was formed and Frank A. Harrison of Lincoln was chosen secretary. A state meeting probably will be held soon at Lincoln when definite plans will be made.

The will of the late W. H. Lanning, Hastings broker, filed for probate, provides for a \$75,000 hotel for self-supporting working girls, to be built at Hastings; a maternity hospital to cost \$40,000 and a perpetual home for nurses. In addition to these legacies there is a sum of \$300,000 set aside for the Lanning Memorial hospital and nurses' dormitory, now in operation. The estate is valued at \$750,000.

Suits for damages totaling \$46,116.40 against Cedar and Dixon counties, brought by relatives of Frank Brizeno and Mabel Mae Bouwers, both of South Sioux City, who were drowned when the car in which they were riding went over a high embankment into the Missouri river on the county line road between the two counties, will be tried before the district court at Pender, now in session.

The Fairbury board of education has voted to ask for recognition as a vocational school in agriculture under the Smith-Hughes act. The plan is to build a separate building for a farm work shop and make the course of study distinctly practical to farming interests of the locality.

Saunders county has a large two-ton truck which will be used by the county for heavy hauling in connection with the extensive road improvements resulting from the new law just passed by the legislature providing for better roads in Nebraska.

According to Beatrice police of \$700 in liberty bonds and war savings stamps stolen from the office of the Wilber Farmers Elevator company, on the evening of February 4, only one \$50 bond has so far been recovered.

Victory Liberty loan workers of Rock county are going to print in the newspapers of the county, and afterwards in pamphlet form, the names and amounts of subscription, of every person who takes Victory loan notes. The Methodist Sunday school at Aurora took an Easter offering to purchase a Victory Liberty bond for the endowment of the Huntington chair of religion in the Nebraska Wesleyan university.

Jefferson was the first county and Platte Center the first city to go "over the top" in the Victory Liberty loan campaign. Platte Center had her quota three hours after the drive opened.

Saline county vigorously resented the quota of \$890,000 given the county in the Victory loan campaign. Several adjoining counties of equal size were given much smaller allotments. At a special election at Hartington voters of the city approved the plan of selling \$25,000 worth of bonds for the purpose of erecting a city hall and auditorium.

At a meeting of the Saline county bankers, held at Crete, it was voted that each bank of the county give \$10 towards a prize for the boys and girls club work.

Sixty-six men registered for the university school of agriculture short course being staged at Lincoln to help provide tractor operators for the Nebraska good roads program.

Wheat is in an excellent condition all over Saunders and surrounding counties, and with present moisture a bumper crop is almost a sure thing. York is looking forward to a monster delegation of Spanish-American war veterans May 19-21, the dates set for the state reunion there.

The soldiers, sailors and marines of Jefferson county met at Fairbury, April 17, and perfected a World War Veterans' Association. North Bend's city council has approved seven blocks of city paving to be done this summer.

Oscola is laying plans for the organization of a fast amateur baseball team this season.

Scores of telephone poles were broken down and hundreds of window lights were broken in a hail and wind storm which struck Hastings and vicinity. Halfstones larger than teacups were picked up six hours after the storm was over.

B. A. George and W. S. Whitten of Lincoln were chosen president and secretary, respectively of the Pershing Historical Highway association, at a convention held at Lincoln of delegates from states through which the highway will pass.

After deliberating but a few minutes, and the taking of a single ballot, a jury at Neligh brought in an instructed verdict awarding 1-cent damages in the case of Royal V. Sheets, prominent member of the Nonpartisan league, who sued seven members of the Antelope county council of defense for \$35,000 damages he said he suffered when he was called before the council to answer charges of pro-Germanism.

Several prominent western Nebraska men have started a movement to secure state aid for the completion of four bridges across the Platte river in Morrill county. Two of these bridges are now under construction, and the county has raised its share of the funds. The bridges under construction, and those proposed, cross the Platte at Scottsbluff to Gering, Minitare to Melbeta and at Henry and Morrill.

George P. Wolz, president of the state good roads association, made the assertion at Fremont the other day that good roads boosters had got much more than they expected from the legislature and that remarkable road improvement may be expected during the coming two years in Nebraska.

Figures compiled by the Omaha Chamber of Commerce, show that Nebraska stands fifth in the number of hogs. Taking the years 1910-1919, inclusive, the number of hogs raised in this state annually has been 3,922,000. Iowa leads with 8,931,600, and then comes Illinois, Missouri, Indiana and Nebraska.

Platte Center, this state, the first town in the Tenth federal reserve district to reach its quota in the Victory Liberty loan drive, is going to print in pamphlet form the names and amounts of subscriptions of every person who buys a Victory bond.

Nebraska is the ninth state in the union to enact a law providing for the organization of personal credit unions. The law in this state will be administered through the department of trade and commerce, under the civil code administrative law.

The recent meeting of the southwestern Nebraska teachers' association held at Holdrege, was the largest sectional association ever held in Nebraska. McCook was chosen as the place for holding the meeting next year.

A thousand-bird poultry plant has been added to the University of Nebraska experimental sub-station at North Platte. The purpose is to experiment with poultry under central and western Nebraska conditions.

Ex-Governor John H. Moorehead is named as president of the Nebraska State bank of Falls City, which has been granted a charter by the state banking board. The capital stock of the new institution is \$40,000.

Erection of an alfalfa mill at Plattsmouth was assured by action of the city council, when it voted to vacate the necessary ground for the structure, which is to cost in the neighborhood of \$50,000.

The Lincoln city council has been presented with a petition containing 1,800 names for the legalizing of a Sunday theaters. The issue will be voted upon at the general city election, May 6.

At a mass meeting of farmers at Ulysses resolutions were adopted and copies sent our representatives at Washington requesting the repeal of the daylight saving law, passed by our last congress.

One thousand dollars was the price paid for the first sack of cement made under the wet process by the Nebraska Cement company at Superior. Nebraska leads all the states in the union in the production of alfalfa. The state's production last year was 1,583,720 tons. Colorado was second with 1,407,330 tons.

The First National bank of Wahoo has placed a contract for a new and fully modern bank building to be erected on the site of their present location in the city.


The Brandeis interests at Omaha are making preparations to construct a twenty-story building near their present site in the city.

Women of De Witt plan to contest the results of the recent election, when pool halls were permitted to operate by a single vote.

Fremont police are establishing an automobile "pound" for automobiles that do not have 1919 license numbers. The Beatrice Farmers' union has 32 local organizations in Gage county with a membership of about 1,000.

A large number of Nebraskans were among the 12,000 soldiers who landed in this county Easter Sunday.
