Charles Richardson Injured

Charles Richardson, of Red Cloud brakeman, was the victim of a most unfortunate and gruesome accident last Friday evening, when in attempting to swing up on the step of a moving engine, his foot slipped, precipitating his body under the engine which passed over him cutting off his right foot and breaking his left leg in three places.

The accident occurred at Holdrege at 9:30 Friday evening, and Richardson was brought to McCook on No. 3. He is now in the Co operative hospital, his condition being considered serious by attending physicians.

The story of the accident as nearly as can be determined runs as follows: Richardson signaled the engineer to back up and hook onto the train. As the engine passed him he attempted to swing himself up on the step but failed to make it, falling down and underneath the engine which passed over the lower part of his body. None of the crew were witnesses of the accident, which happened in the space of a few minutes. The first they knew of it was, after having annexed the waiting cars, they started down the track again, when the engineer then noticed a large crowd blocking the way. No time was lost in securing medical services for the injured man whose condition was manifestly serious.

Richardson's family were immediately notified of the accident, his mother and sister coming down from Red Cloud Saturday morning. His father who was in Wyoming arrived Saturday night on No. 6.

Later—Reports are to the effect that the injured man is much better and hopes for his recovery are entertained by those in attendance.—McCook Gazette.

Keeping Up To Date

In keeping with the progress of our city the Cowden-Kaley Clothing Co., are making some marked improvements in the interior of their store.
