Changes in Game Law

To County Attorneys, Sheriffs and Clerks

I wish to call your particular attention to the new provision in the Game Law as enacted by the regular session of the Legislature, relating to the open season on prairie chickens. The old law provided an open season from September 15th to November 15th. The new law provides this open season to be from October 15th to November 15th inclusive. The open season for any other game birds is unchanged, being the same as provided by the Session Laws of 1917.

The force of regular game wardens will be increased by a number of Federal Game Wardens as well as the law enforcement officers of this State and all of the various inspectors in the Department of Agriculture. Every effort will be made to prosecute offenders who violate provisions of this law before the open season begins.

Free Farm Exchange Bulletin

Kanred Wheat

Kanred wheat is an improved strain of Turkey Red wheat, originated by the Kansas Experiment Station. Kanred wheat is neither a gold brick nor a freak wonder. It is simply a good wheat adapted to the peculiar conditions of this dry western wheat country. It is an illustration of what is possible in the improvement of crops and animals through scientific selection.

Kanred wheat was grown in a number of Nebraska counties the past year and reports show that it outyielded the common wheat 5 bu. and upwards. It has a larger berry and better color, also the straw was stiffer and stood up better.

Kanred Wheat in Webster County
Robert and Leonard Reiher of Red Cloud raised Kanred wheat and it yielded 20 bushels while their Turkey Red at the side of it yielded 14 bu. They raised 1200 bu. and have about 900 bu. left to sell at \$2.45 per bu. at the farm.

We have a sample of this wheat at the office and will mail out a sample upon request. Farmers wanting some of this wheat should get their order into Robert Reiher, Red Cloud, at once, as there is a big demand for this wheat from other parts of the state, and he will turn his surplus wheat to farmers outside of the county.
