#### Farm Bureau Notes

##### PICNIC

A successful picnic was held in the grove on the Steward farm. This farm has an ideal picnic ground. The big feature of the day was the dinner. It was placed on the table and the crowd was served cafeteria style. There was also lemonade, which was furnished by Col. C. E. Besse.

The programme consisted of music by the Red Cloud band. After the concert by the band, Mr. Steward, who is president of the Webster County Improved Live Stock Breeders' Association, introduced County Agent Leader R. E. Holley from Lincoln, who talked on County Agent work in relation to Live Stock and Boys' & Girls' Club work. Professor Howard Gramlich, head of the Animal Husbandry department was then introduced and talked to the members of the calf club on fitting and showing their calves. He gave a demonstration, using Mr. Steward's show calves. He talked to the Live Stock Breeders on the value of Organization, and gave a judging demonstration, using Clarence Johnston's aged bull and his junior bull calf, and Mr. Steward's senior bull calves and aged cow.

It was a great treat to have Professor Gramlich with us on this occasion. He left the Iowa State Fair Tuesday evening, rode all night, and came down from Hastings in a car in order to be with us on schedule time.

A ball game between the married men and the single men was the closing feature of the picnic and was won by the married men.

This picnic was held in honor of the 33 members of the Boys' and Girls' Calf Club. This is the first Calf Club in the state of Nebraska. After we had secured Professor Gramlich for this picnic, it was thought best to invite all breeders of better live stock, and those interested in better live stock for Webster county. It was regretted that all the breeders of Pure Bred Live Stock did not attend this picnic.

It is very important that every county have an organization of Live Stock Breeders, and every breeder of Pure Bred Live Stock can well afford to spend 3 or 4 days during the year at meetings of this nature, in order to get acquainted with his fellow breeders. If he can't afford to take this time off, he had better get out of the game.
