Nebraska Leads in Number of Project Statements

The following is reprinted from the Public Roads Magazine published by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Roads for July: "In the number of projects approved, Nebraska leads with 19, and the mileage of those projects, 385.31, also puts the State at the top of the list in the length of roads to be improved.

Ohio ranks second, with 17 projects approved and a total length of 92.65 miles.

New Hampshire comes third in the number of approvals, 16, but all of them together have a mileage of 18.09 miles.

One Ohio project, 6.6 miles long, will cost an average of \$65,909 a mile. Other high cost roads are, 7.08 miles in New York to be built at an average of \$60,464, and 16.6 miles in Kansas; the cost of which will average \$55,473
