Any bird showing symptoms of disease when received or during the exhibition will be removed at once.

All birds will be scored by the judge according to the American Standard of perfection.

Sweepstake ribbon to highest scoring trio of chickens.

In computing for Sweepstakes ribbon, white birds are handicapped 2 points; black 1 1/2 points and buff 1 point over parti-colored.

STUDENTS STOCK JUDGING CONTEST

Each High School is allowed to enter one team consisting of 3 members. Highest scoring team \$10.00, Second team 6.00, Third team 3.00.

Highest Individual 4.00, Second Highest Individual 2.00, Third Highest Individual 1.00. All members of calf and pig clubs are eligible to compete in individual contest with member of judging teams.

Each contestant will be required to place 4 hogs, 4 cattle, 4 horses and give reasons for placings. 100 points is perfect score. 60 points for placings and 40 points for reason.

WOMAN'S DEPARTMENT

No entry fees in this department. Entries close at 6:00 P. M. on Tuesday, Dec. 9, except baking, which may be entered until noon Wednesday, Dec. 10. No entries may be removed until 4:00 P. M. Friday, Dec. 12.

Rules for Entries

- 1. All articles must have been made by exhibitor.
2. Any article having received first premium at Farmer's Institute heretofore cannot be entered for a premium.
3. Any article entered in a display cannot be entered for a single premium also.
4. Articles entered for premiums may be sold by exhibitors but the officers of the Institute will neither make sales nor collect money. Articles sold cannot be removed from hall until close of Institute.
5. All articles entered for premiums must be finished.
6. Each bread exhibitor can enter but one brand of flour.
7. In case of no competition, the first premium will be awarded second money.
8. The exhibits will be closed during the judging, but the judges will answer all questions after the judging is completed.
A prize of \$5.00 will be paid to the lady making the largest number of entries, including entries in the ladies department and the poultry department.

DISCRETIONARY AND LOAN DEPARTMENT

The institute wishes to have a loan exhibit of articles either old or rare or unusual in any way. Special care will be taken of these articles and we hope to have a large display.
