#### LIBRARY NOTES

If you wish to read the new magazines, come to the library. Also the Nebraska State Journal, the Hastings Daily Tribune and Red Cloud papers. During the month of November, 1736 books were drawn from the library. Of these 721 were juvenile, 870 fiction, 82 non-fiction and 63 magazines. The largest number of books drawn in one day was 112.

The publishers of the books of Booth Tarkington recently announced that to date they had sold 1,324,945 copies of Mr. Tarkington's volumes of "Penrod," and 234,531 copies have been sold. The advance sale of "Ramsey Millioiland" was much larger than that of "Penrod." "Ramsey Millioiland" has just been received at the library.

You will be interested in the "Young Visitors," by Daisy Ashford—written years ago by a nine-year old English girl. Her characters are evidently fictitious, but quite as evidently colored and patterned after people she knew and her unconscious criticisms are rather appalling. J. M. Barrie writes the introduction which should not be read before the story.

One of the greatest annual events in the literary world is the award of the Pulitzer prizes for the best books published in the different departments of literature. This year the prize of \$1000 for the best biography has been awarded to "The Education of Henry Adams." This is the highest recogni-

tion of literary merit attainable and is quite in accordance with the remarkable reception that this unique autobiography has met with on every side. It has sold like a popular novel and still leads the list of best sellers of non-fiction books in the "Bookman," a position it has occupied for several

months. "The Education of Henry Adams" is to be had at the library.

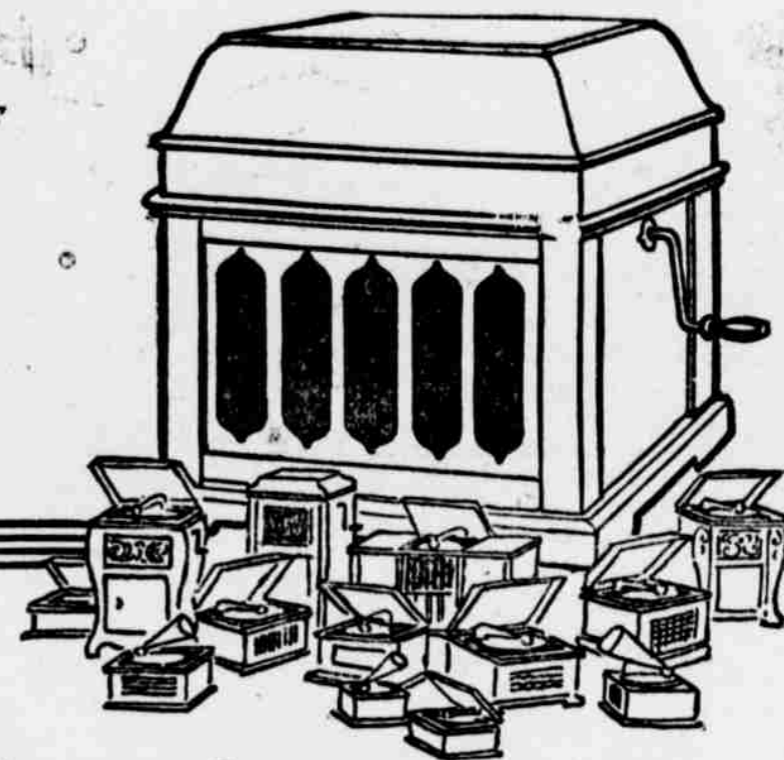
