**Injured in Family Quarrel**

A family quarrel at the Frank Leabrandt home, south of this city, on last Saturday evening, resulted in the death of a young boy, Andrew, being crippled for the balance of his life.

The parents had been having a rather strenuous discussion over some trifling matter, when the wife seized the shot gun, thinking to frighten her husband into submission. In the scuffle that followed the weapon was discharged, the lead striking the boy in the foot. He was later brought to the Mitchell hospital, in this city, and a portion of the injured member was amputated.

**COUNTY SCHOOL NOTES**  
(By County Superintendent)

Blanks have been sent to each of the teachers of the county from the "Dept. of Public Welfare." This is another of the requirements of the new law. The State Superintendent asks that you speedily return to Mrs. Emily P. Hornberger the blanks properly filled out. The parents will have to help the teachers in this if they are to have any success. All the help that the parents can give the teachers along the different lines of work is much appreciated. No school can be a success without the co-operation of parent and teacher.

It was the plan to have study center work this semester conducted in Red Cloud and Blue Hill. The instructor was to have come from Hastings. This was to cost \$350.00 or thereabouts, for the semester. The cost per teacher depended wholly upon the number taking part. If only ten took part it would cost \$35.00 each. This seems considerable but when you consider the cost of a summer school's credits, is not excessive.

It has been hard to organize the thing, to arrange for meetings and to know just whom to depend on. The fact that Hastings thought Guide Rock would not be hardy to have in the list cut out a number of teachers. All things considered it has seemed best to give up the plan and urge teachers to write to the school of their choice, stating just what study they prefer to take, asking for terms and advice and start as soon as possible to take something to count up college hours toward the next county certificate they expect to get. According to the new law, second grade certificates require 8 hours credit, first grade certificates 12 hours. Practically all the higher schools are giving these correspondence courses.

In case any town or group of teachers wish to put the study center project across, an instructor can be had from Hastings for \$25.00 per lesson plus expenses. There are ten lessons given in a semester's work. The instructor must come from some of the colleges to gain the hours of college credit that are required for renewing the certificate. Otherwise anyone that could teach it would do.

Miss Stella Hindenbach of Dist. 23 has resigned to take Dist. 40. She has done good work and Dist. 40 feel that they have been in luck to get her.

Miss Violet Davis had to resign on account of ill health. Goldie Robinson has been substituting for her. Miss Robinson was very much liked.

In voting about joining a consolidated or rural high school, only those outside this district are eligible and they vote together, not district by district. In this way a district not wishing to join could be forced into joining if the other districts in the proposed district were strong enough to make the majority.

After a child has one certificate of award the next 6 attendance cards earn a gold seal and the next 6 are sent with the certificate of award when a large diploma of honor is issued.

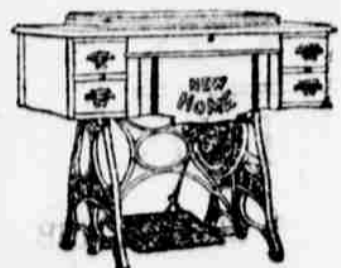
