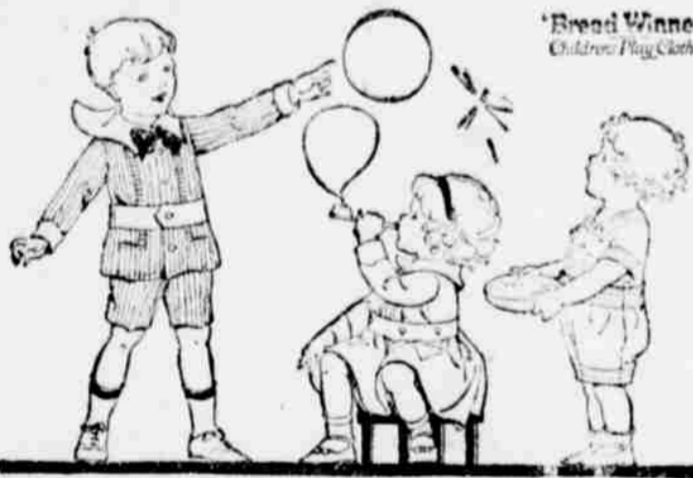

Local Baptists Must Contribute \$5,744

Announcement of the amount the Red Cloud Baptist church has been asked to accept as its quota of the \$100,000,000 fund to be raised by the Northern Baptists between April 25 and May 2, has just been made by A. B. Newell, state campaign director of the Northern Baptists' New World Movement.

The Red Cloud Baptists have been assigned the sum of \$5,744 as their contribution toward the huge budget that is to be expended in the great spiritual and well fare campaign inaugurated by the Baptists for America and the Far East. By accepting the task of raising the \$5,744 Red Cloud Baptists will become a vital part of the herculean task undertaken by the denomination in a work that is to touch directly or indirectly, practically every man, woman and child in the nation.

Mr. J. M. Hewett, chairman of the Baptist Minute Men for the locality, will guide the efforts of the \$5,744 Drive.

Dr. John Y. Albison, campaign director, outlined and defined the aims of the program, saying "The New World Movement, for which \$100,000,000 is being raised, is a vigorous and aggressive application of Christianity to the problems of the world. Thirty millions of the sum has been set aside for educational work in the United States. \$12,000,000 for new buildings. \$18,000,000 for increasing the income yielding endowment funds which will help out the situation of the under-faculty. Further millions will be used for the education of children of Indians and negroes, the Burmans, Chinese and Africans. Hospitals, welfare stations, mission centers and churches will be built throughout the territory of the denomination—which is almost the wide world.

A regular meeting of the Red Cloud Local of the Farmers' Union was held in the I. O. O. F. hall Tuesday evening which was well attended. Many business matters were brought before the meeting. It was decided that, owing to the increase in volume of business in the grocery department that more room must be had for the storage of surplus stock. A large portion of the rear of the building will be remodeled and made into a ware room where the stock may be conveniently handled and stored. Several new members were added to the ever increasing membership roll.
