Farm Bureau Notes

WEBSTER COUNTY FAIR

The Board of Directors of the Webster county fair met Monday night and laid plans for this year's fair, which will be held August 24, 25, 26 and 27.

One of the big problems confronting the fair, is to arouse more interest in the Agricultural and Live Stock departments. These departments have felt of the past few years, due to war conditions and scarcity of labor, on the farm. It takes considerable time to fit live stock for a fair.

Mr. C. B. Steward, president of Webster County Improved Live Stock Breeder's Association, Frank Kral and Fred Householder, appeared before the Board of directors in the interests of the live stock breeders of the county.

Railroad transportation has been the main reason why live stock breeders of the south part of the county, could not show at the fair. A committee was appointed to see if the Burlington R. R. Co. would take the stock cars, coming up to Blue Hill, from Red Cloud, on over the passenger, to save unloading at Blue Hill, and taking two days to make the trip. If this arrangement could be made, it would solve the transportation problem for the stock breeders of the south part of the county.

The Fair Association will revise their premium list and make some changes in the classification of live stock. If sufficient interest is aroused to warrant a good live stock show, one day of the fair will be set aside for Stock Day, and competent judges will be secured, to judge the stock on this day, and they will give open reasons for their placings. This will be done for educational purposes, and there will be no horse races on this day.

AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT

The same method as planned last year, will be tried out again this year. The Fair Association have purchased a handsome trophy, in the form of a cup; the same to be awarded to the Farmers' Union Local, making the best local display. Each Farmers' Union Local should appoint their committees now, to represent their local and see that their local is represented at the fair. Each local will be given space in Agricultural Hall for the arrangement of their agricultural display. These local exhibits will compete against each other the same as counties compete against each other at the State Fair. Articles in these exhibits will show in the open classes for prize money also.

If you want to make Webster county a good agricultural and live stock county, plan now to show some of your best live stock and agricultural products at the County Fair.

The Webster County Fair, coming just before the State Fair, would be an ideal assembling point to make up a good county exhibit for the State Fair. Showing at a fair is not a money-making proposition, but an advertising medium. Its value, to the community, cannot be estimated in dollars and cents.

HOGS TO TEXAS

Another shipment of Nebraska pure bred hogs has been sent to Texas. This is the third shipment south in six months. Two carloads, eighty-six head, were recently shipped from Clay county to the southern state. The hogs were registered Poland China fall gilts. They will be used in boys' and girls' pig club work, each pig going to a different boy or girl. Banks and other Texas institutions are financing the purchase of Nebraska hogs in an effort to promote the live stock industry of that state. A delegation of Texans visited Nebraska last December and inspected stock in several counties. One shipment of hogs went south in December and another in January. The deals were made by Nebraska county farm bureaus and Texas agricultural agents.

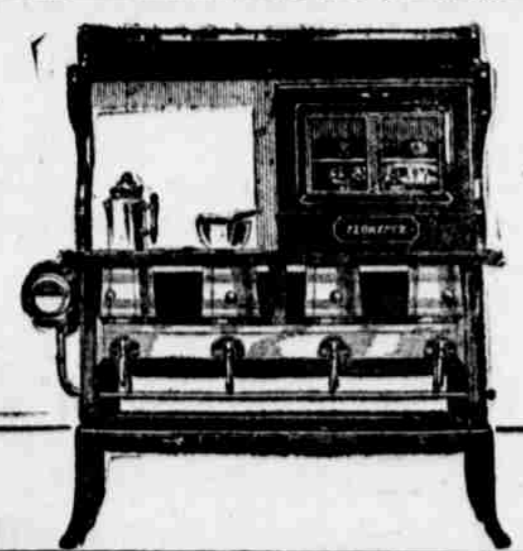
