IMMIGRANTS ARE BEING SWINDLED

American Sharpers Throng New York City to Prey on People From Old World.

USE SIMPLE SCHEMES

Sell Brooklyn Bridge and Statue of Liberty Every Day—Five-Cent Subway Tickets Bring \$20 for a Trip to Chicago.

New York.—"From stevedore to success" briefly sketches the careers of many immigrants to America. But it does not tell the struggles, the hardships and even the indignities endured by many immigrants, including some of the most successful ones, during the intervening period between their arrival in America and the time when they achieve success or suffer failure, as the case may be.

Every year brings a fresh crop of stories about successful immigrants, but it brings also stories about immigrants leaving America, disappointed and discouraged, because, lacking governmental protection and friendly guidance, they fell into the hands of New York city sharpers who fleeced them of their savings.

Tricks Are Many.

The tricks of these sharpers, as catalogued by persons who have investigated complaints, range from the outright sale of the Statue of Liberty and Brooklyn bridge for an amount equivalent to the entire savings of the immigrant to the sale of subway tickets at a cost of from \$10 to \$20 each, "good for a trip to Chicago."

One artful confidence man who waxed wealthy without the necessity for prolonged honest effort garnered immigrant dollars through the sale of green tickets at \$1 to \$5 apiece entitling the bearers to admission to the United States.

More than 2,000 immigrants annually file complaints of exploitation with the bureau of industries and immigration of New York state.

Immigrants Fall Easy Prey.

Newly arrived immigrants, unfamiliar with our language, customs and laws and form of government, are easy

prey, and many individuals take advantage of that fact.

New York is not the only state where immigrants are being exploited. California, Massachusetts and Ohio have also official reports of frauds practiced on immigrants. Practically every other state can tell the same story.

Overcharging for baggage, frauds perpetrated by so-called "private" bankers, the sale of worthless inventions, fake partnerships, the passing of Confederate money and counterfeit coins and outright robbery through pocket picking and open violence and force are common throughout the country.

KILLS SON FOR BERRY THIEF

Two Farmers Try to Protect Patch From Raids Unknown to Each Other.

Concord, N. H.—Oliver C. Dimond, a farmer of West Concord district, was shot and killed late at night by his father, who mistook him for a berry thief, according to reports to the police. Raids upon their berry patch had aroused the ire of the Dimonds. The father said he decided to arm himself and lie in wait for the raiders.

Unknown to the father, the son decided upon the same course, and when the elder Dimond saw an armed man emerge from the thicket he said he fired. Oliver Dimond died soon afterward. After investigating the shooting the authorities decided no action on their part was necessary.

"LAND OF PLENTY"

Western Canada a Country of Marvelous Fertility.

Then there is the oat crop, with a yield of one hundred to 110 and 120 bushels per acre, where but 80 and 90 bushels were expected, but their value, apart from that of barley and rye and flax, will carry us over the billion dollar mark.

Of course all this means—but we had almost forgotten to speak of the cattle and horses, the sheep and the pigs, the dairy and many other farm products, the increase and production of which this year will bring in many more million dollars—all this means that there will be a rush of buyers to Western Canada this fall, during the winter, and next spring.

A certain amount of satisfaction is derived by those "back home here," whose friends are writing them inquiring the statements that are appearing in the press of wheat yields of thirty, forty, and fifty bushels to the acre; of oats yielding anywhere from sixty to 120 bushels per acre. Districts have not been specially favored. Travel anywhere, eight hundred miles east and west, four hundred miles north and south, and it is the same story, splendid yields, good acreage, excellent prices, easy marketing, but labor a little scarce.—Advertisement.
