**Blackledge Chosen Judge**

His Plurality in District Over 2500

The selection of Attorney Lewis H. Blackledge as District Judge in the recent election is of more than passing interest. Not alone that Webster county felt itself entitled to this honor and that it had put forward as candidate the man eminently fitted for the position, nor that Mr. Blackledge himself put his whole energy into the campaign, working effectively, but that apparently every voter in the county felt himself, or herself, to be seriously interested in the matter. They felt that the cause was just and the man was worthy and so set about it to put him over the top.

The 'Blackledge Club' did efficient work and lots of it and thoroughly spread the news of their candidate and why he should be elected. The fine thing about it was, that it was entirely distinct from any effort of the candidate himself, was a wholly voluntary movement on the part of interested citizens, entirely nonpartisan and intensely human.

The Chief and all the other newspapers in Red Cloud had part in it, and, in fact, there was hardly a dissenting voice in the county. This situation made itself felt throughout the district of seven counties. Complete unofficial returns are now in and show that Mr. Blackledge has carried every county in the district except Adams and Phelps, the home counties of the opposing candidates, and even there he received a handsome vote. The south side rallied to his support with enthusiasm, and in Harlan he has a plurality of 580, in Franklin of 807 and in Webster of 1546. On the north side he carried Kearney by 270 and Clay by 94. His total plurality is 2541.

Judge Dilworth seems to be chosen as the second man, having a plurality over the next candidate of 734. The two pluralities added will give the actual figures by which Mr. Blackledge was elected.

According to late reports Governor McKelvie was re-elected and Congressman Andrews carried the district by a majority of 5000. 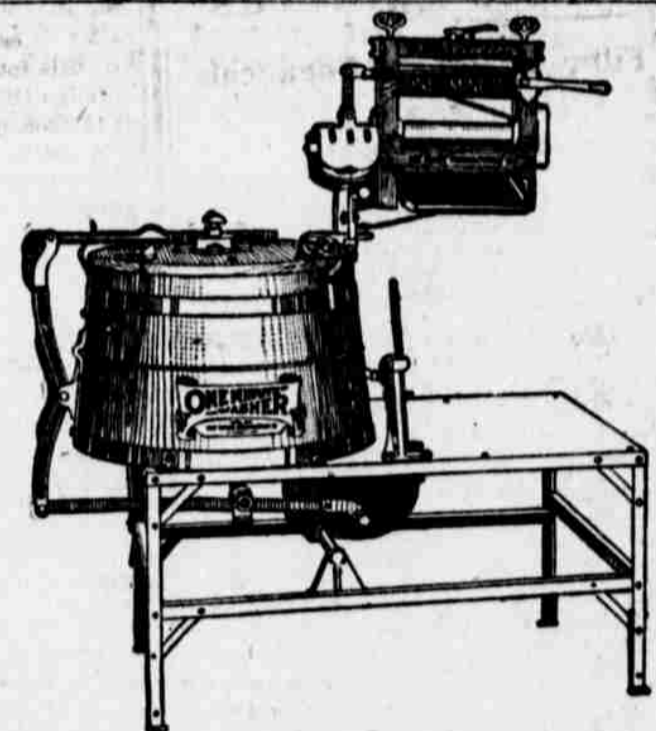
