The selection of Attorney Lewis H. Buckledge as District Judge in the reinterest. Not alone that Webster coun ty leit itself entitled to this he nor at d that it had put forward as candidate the man eminently fitted for the post tion, nor that Mr Blackledge himself

him wer the top'. work and lots of it and thoroughly spread the news of their candidate and why he should be elected. The fine thing about it was, that it was entire ly distinct from any effort of the cand . date himself, was a wholly voluntary movement on the part of interested citizens, entirely nonpartisan and intensely human.

The Chief and all ti. other newspapers in Red Cloud had part in it, and, in fact, there was hardly a dissenting voice in the county. This situation made itself felt the oughout the district of seven counties. Complete unofficial returns are now in and show that Mr Blackledge has carried every county in the district except Adams and Phelps, the home counties of the opposing candidates, and even there he received a handsome vote. The south side railied to his support with enthu slasm, and in Harlan be has a plurality of 580, in Franklin of 807 and in Webster of 1546. On the north side he carried Kearney by 270 and Clay by 94. His total plurality is 2541.

Judge Dilworth seems to be chosen as the second man, having a plurality over the next candidate of 734. The two pluralities added will give the actual figures by which Mr. Blackledge was elected.


