dred and thirty two. The city super-intendent has on the average nineteen teachers under his supervision. RURAL EDUCATION A NATIONAL EMERGENCY

In a democracy every child is the community's child, the state's child, the nation's child. The obligation for his proper education for greater service to community, state and nation is, therefore, a three-fold obligation apportioned among them. More than half the nation's children are enrolled in the rural schools, taught by untrained, poorly paid teachers, in poor buildings, poorly equipped, for short terms, for a short period of years. The safety and strength of a democracy are determined by the intelligence and character of the masses of its people. The standard of intelligence of the people is determined by the quality and amount of their edu-cation. Civilization is no stronger than its weakest link. The weakest link in the chain of the nation's education and civilzation is the rural school-It must be strengthened, let it cost

what it may.

The new type of country teacher must have a special training for her special work, training that will give her knowledge of country things, country people, country needs, a sympathy with them, a love and appreciation of them.
