STATE CAPITAL

Epperson's bill doing away with Fourth of July pardons passed the house without opposition.

The senate favors passes for ministers and charitable workers according to a bill reported out a few days ago.

Every member of the house introduced one or more bills. Two introduced fifty bills each. Two introduced only one each.

The chiropractic bill was the cause of considerable oratory in the house. The bill proposes to reduce the educational requirements for securing a license in Nebraska.

The Osterman bill that provides for the condemnation of railroad right of way for highway purposes has been reported out and is on the road to passage. This is recognized as a good bill.

Three railroad "full crew" bills were backed on to sidings by the house and the tracks torn up so they will not have another chance to get back to the main line. They were union labor bills.

H. R. 478, introduced by Speaker Anderson, cures present troubles in the voting by mail law. Under the present law it is possible for a voter to vote in several different precincts by mail.

H. R. No. 1, is the bill allowing the city of Omaha to go into the electric light business. It is classed as an R. B. Howell measure. Plenty of fireworks will be visible when it reaches the floor.

The senate is spending considerable time on a bill relating to workmen's compensation. The bill was prepared by the labor commissioner and is designed to correct inequalities in the present law.

The American Legion is taking an active interest in Senator Norval's bill repealing the Siman language law. A public hearing will be held by the committee having this bill in charge and Legion representatives promise to be present.

If the house judiciary committee has its way women will not be compelled to serve on juries. A minority report will be submitted and different action may be taken when the bill is reported. The alien land ownership bill was also killed in committee.

The movie censorship bill is attracting more attention so far than any other bill that has been introduced. Two or three public hearings have been held by the committee. The bill has the backing of strong interests and is also being strongly opposed.

The banking bill went thru the house without any particular trouble. After it becomes a law banks and bankers will be more closely looked after than they have been in the past and it will not be so easy for inexperienced persons to get into the banking business.

Three dollars per week is the tuition rate fixed for those who would go from a country district to a high school. At first it was intended to fix the rate at the actual cost of instruction but it was pointed out that this might open the way for a lot of litigation so the bill was changed.

The senate investigating committee is calling in all state officers and asking them to justify their existence and the existence of those who are on their payrolls. The object is to discover overlapping activities and do away with all employees who are not really needed.

One proposed statute requires people who contemplate marriage to apply for a marriage license fifteen days prior to the wedding day. The judge is then to notify parents or guardians by registered mail. Neighboring states are likely to enjoy an increase in their number of marriages if this becomes a law.

Lieutenant Governor Barrows was granted two weeks vacation by the senate. He is commander in chief of the Sons of Veterans and his presence is necessary in Philadelphia Lincoln's birthday. He is also scheduled to deliver some other addresses. While absent he will visit several other state legislatures.

If a measure now being considered becomes a law school teachers will have to be careful about jumping their contracts in the future. The bill provides that a teacher who gives up her place without complying with certain formalities may lose her certificate for the balance of the year. The house favors the bill.

One enthusiastic member of the house proposes to require every automobile owner to file a bond for \$5,000 when he gets a license for his car. This bond is for the protection of anyone who suffers injury from a car. The secretary of state is to accept service in case of a suit so it won't even be necessary to look up the owner if you get hurt by a car.
