#### Farm Bureau Notes

**TOWNSHIP ORGANIZATION**  
Township Organization is now completed in all the townships and the second round of meetings have started putting a program of work in each township. The officers in the last two townships organized are as follows: Oak Creek—Walter Evans, Director, Joe Trine, President, and David McCauley, Secretary. Batin Township—I. W. Crowell, Director, Alex Buckles, President, H. C. Hansen, Vice-president, Clarence Fitz, Secretary, Fremman Erickson, Vencil Zajic, Chas. Cowley, Legislation, Adolph Sidlow, Cost of Production, John Hublen, Henry Rose and H. Cramer, Membership Committee.

Batin Township—First to adopt program of work. Chief source of income, Wheat. Difficulties, smut, rust and low yield. Remedies, introducing improved variety which is rust resistant and treating for smut. Project Leader, I. W. Crowell, Goal, ten farmers to grow Kanred wheat, two smut treating demonstration, two farms to keep Cost of Production records. Soil fertility, sowing sweet clover, Project Leader, V. J. Vavricka. Line Township—Program of work. Main source of income, hogs. Difficulties, hog cholera, pasture, breeding. Remedies, vaccination, trying various crops for pasture, pure bred sires. Project Leader, Jas. Keagle. Eight farmers of Line township made application for having their cattle tested under Federal supervision.

Garfield Township—Main source of income, hogs. Difficulties, hog cholera, tuberculosis and pasture. Project Leader, N. P. Campbell. Two farmers enrolled for Pure Bred sires only. J. W. Lawrence of the Extension Service of Lincoln attended these meetings and helped to select the program of work.

#### COUNTY FARM BUREAU MEET

A meeting was held on Wednesday, the Directors, Presidents and Secretaries of each township organization was present. The constitution and by-laws were adopted. The county program of work was adopted and it was voted to publish a monthly Farm Bureau Exchange Bulletin, to co-operate with the Webster County Live Stock Breeders Association and furnish signs to farmers, who enroll in the "Pure Bred Sires Only" campaign.

A. M. Ray of Bladen was selected to go as a delegate from the Webster County Farm Bureau to Lincoln and hear the report of the Committee of 17.

Under the present plan of Township Organization, each township has a director on the Webster County Directorite. The directors elect the Executive Board of five members. They are as follows: John Ryan, President, Alex Buschow, Vice-president, Fred Householder, Secretary, I. W. Crowell and C. G. Pitney.
