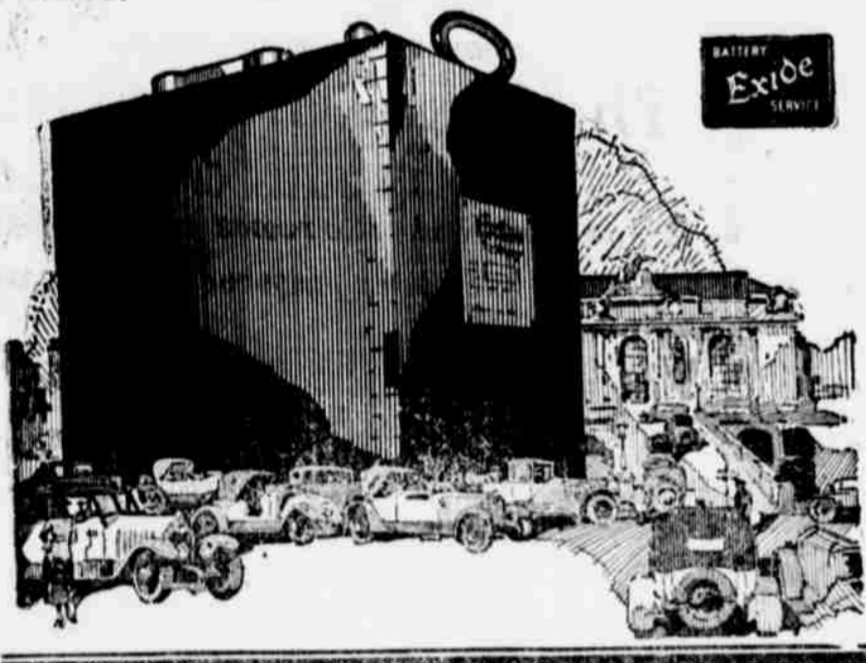

#### COUNTY AGENT CONFERENCE

#### KANRED WHEAT GROWERS

The Kanred wheat growers meeting was held Thursday. P. H. Stewart, Extension Specialist in Agronomy, of Lincoln was present and explained the method of inspection and certification for this year. Mr. Stewart said, "Webster county ranked first in the production of Kanred wheat." Over 3000 acres are being raised this year and practically all comes from certified seed. The committee appointed by the Webster County Farm Bureau as a Field Crops Committee is Robert Reiber, Red Cloud, Frank Sutton, Inavale and L. P. Keal, Bladen.

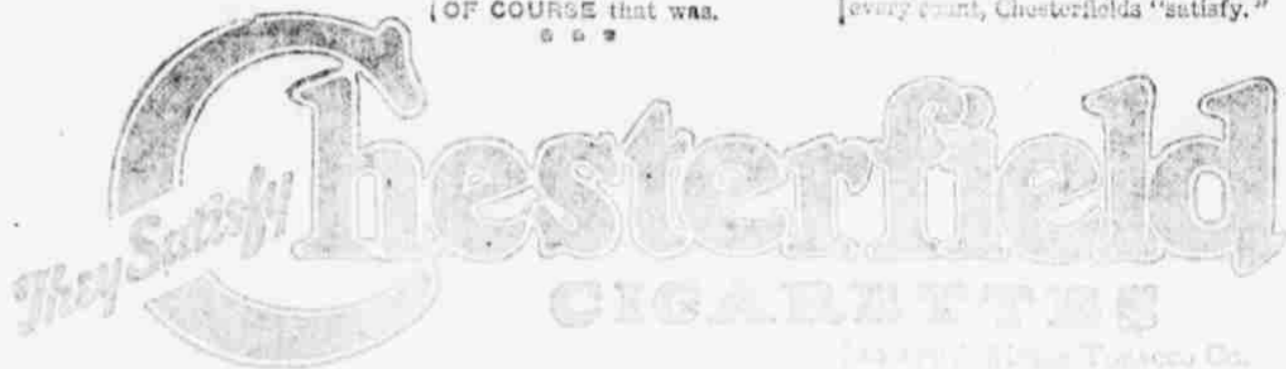
## The tale of a dog- with a moral
