COMMISSIONERS MET

ON TUESDAY

Red Cloud, December 13 1921

The County Board of Commissioners met at 1 p. m. as per adjournment of November 1st. All members present.

Motion made by Crowell and seconded by Shidler that the Board reconsider their action on the claims of the Red Cloud Farmers' Institute and the Webster County Fair Association for aid as agricultural societies and that the action taken by the Board on November 1, 1921 be received and set aside. Motion carried. After a further discussion of this matter by the Board and W. E. France President of the Webster County Fair Association and J. S. Gilham representing the Red Cloud Farmers' Institute the following action was taken:

Moved by Stumphenhurst seconded by Shidler that whereas the County Board did on the 11th day of August 1921 make a levy of .01 mill on each dollar of the assessed valuation of said county to provide for a fund of not to exceed \$2000 for aid to agricultural societies of said county as is provided for in House Roll No. 130 of Session Laws of 1921 and did include said .01 mill in the levy of 1.3 mills for the General Fund and did intend that .01 mill should constitute and be a fund to aid agricultural societies of said county and that 1.2 mills should constitute the general

fund and be used as such.

The County Treasurer is hereby instructed to make a separate fund to be known as a fund for Aid to County Agricultural Societies and in collecting the taxes for the year 1921 to deduct from the General Fund of 1.3 mills and place in said fund .01 mill on each dollar collected not to exceed the sum of \$2000 and the money so collected and placed in said fund to be disposed of by the County Treasurer as is provided for by House Roll No. 130 Session Laws of 1921. Motion carried.

Motion made by Stumphenhurst seconded by Chaplin that County Treasurer be instructed to strike off the assessment of Everett France in Batin Precinct for 1921 same being a double assessment. Motion carried.

Motion made by Chaplin seconded by Crowell that the County Treasurer be instructed to reduce the 1921 assessment of Farmers' Union Co. Operative Association of Cowles in the sum of \$2800. This amount being a double assessment. Motion carried.

Committees from Guide Rock, Superior and Red Cloud appeared before the Board regarding the condition of the road east from Red Cloud to Nuckolls County line. After considerable discussion of this matter, also road conditions in general, the Board assured these committees that as soon as the 1922 funds are available that this road would be put in good condition.

The following claims were audited and allowed and County Clerk instructed to draw warrants on the proper funds in payment of same.
