THE FUTURE OF THE FAMILY

(Contributed)

To the Editor:—In the multiplied effects to restore matters to antebellum conditions, I have so far failed to see anything written along the course I wish to pursue in this communication. We are trying out every paternalistic idea suggested to the most fertile minds, and leaving untouched some things a good deal nearer home, that might be tried with possibly much better effect. We are beseeching the Congress and our Legislatures for help and officers high in government are using their good offices to promote the general good in unheard of ways, and meanwhile we are fully assured that the root of the matter is not touched by any of the legislation enacted, or any of the plans attempted. The financial acumen of the country is at great straits to invent some untried form of taxation in order to raise funds to pay a bonus to the returned soldier, when the major portion of those faithful and loyal men are not asking a bonus or other form of easy money, but only a chance to earn an honest and decent living to sustain the homes they have already founded, and the covenants they have made to cherish and maintain those they love. Clean honest young men, just entering upon the responsibilities of manhood, are, with the exception of the few needed upon farms scarcely able to earn enough to decently clothe themselves and take any sort of place in society because the places they should by right fill and which they are thoroughly competent to fill, are withheld from them, because of cupidity and at times something worse of men who hire. Only two places in any town are still reserved to men: the occasional blacksmith shop and the mens clothing stores. Every other place, schools, banks, cream stations, court houses, stores, academies, and co-ed colleges are filled with girls and women. From the Kindergarten up to the college degree our boys are deprived of all stimulus toward manliness and virility. In the years when they should be imbibing the principles of strenuous living from men they admire, they are cloistered with immature, half appareled girl teachers, more intent upon becoming fashion

plates than the stimulating factors of genuine progress to the next generation.

Our banks are falling woefully short of their conceded position in the community, because about all of that fine paternalism inherent in well conducted banking is dissipated or in some cases entirely lost, through the perplexed business man's intercourse only with girls behind the counter, or beyond the wicket.

Our stores are closed to young men, except possibly one in a place to do the sweeping and heavy lifting and his position is always of the cheap order, without possibility of promotion or increased salary. Yet it is a fact that the ordinary customer would prefer purchasing from an efficient male clerk all the things salable even in a dry-goods store, unless desires and customs have radically changed in a generation.

A chivalric sense of obligation to the new accretion to our voting population is filling our court houses with women, and our courts are hampered by women clerks, and stenographers, especially in divorce and libel cases, until Attorneys are hopeless of bringing out all the salient points of any case, and evidence otherwise promptly furnished is withheld because of the presence of women in official position. If it be asserted here that the officials here protested against are fully able to listen to the deleterious portions of evidence, often required, it should be said that it does not add to their moral and spiritual worth, nor to their value to society. If it be further asserted that nothing should be heard in our courts not admissible in polite society it is confidently answered that in case the courts take a place along with the modern pulpit, in glossing over and excusing the grievous wrongs of the body politic, and destroy all the hope of correcting them. With churches, lodges, and all the capital letter societies known to contain people to some extent who are morally corrupt, and unable because of that fact, to speak out without diminished power and influence, it behooves us to leave the courts unhampered to the correction of evils acknowledged to exist, and to give to them our moral support. Our code of moral ethics needs strenuous revision.

Women with immorally abbreviated skirts and gauze waists do not look pretty to the average man even though they carry about petitions to close Pool halls, and effect a grade of moral sense belied by their apparel, or lack of it. As between Pool halls as ordinarily conducted, and the modern dance, where decently clad young men are brought into exceedingly close proximity to indecently clothed young and middle aged women, the Pool halls do not suffer in the comparison. And what is here written of the modern dance may just as truthfully be written concerning the Lodge or church function, excepting probably some degree of distinction should be made in social standing. The ever recurrent question in view of these things is, what becomes of the family of the future? If young men are to be deprived of the paying, respectable positions of life not because they are not willing and competent, but because women can be hired more cheaply and many times for reasons not nice to be written, if public life for women as seems to be the case, destroys in marked degree the fine texture of womanly character, which men uniformly love and respect, if it destroys in many cases the homing desire and the man's ability to furnish a home, then it becomes a menace and a thing of evil.
