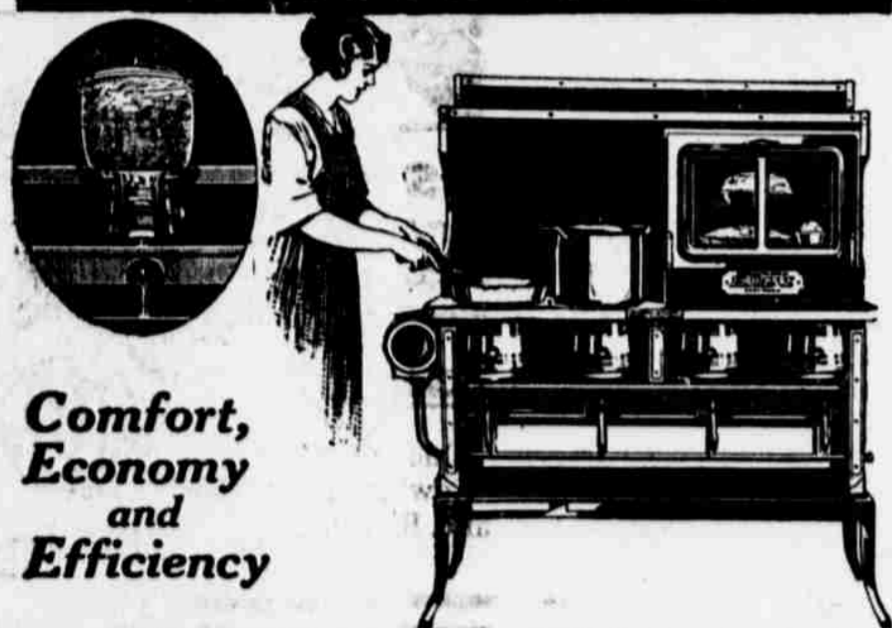

### COUNTY SCHOOL NOTES

(By County Superintendent)

Application for Free High School Privileges should be made in the next few days so that the list can be sent to the directors.

Those wishing land transferred for school privileges should tend to it right away.

It is very important to get the census correct as the State Apportionment depends upon it.

The eighth grade marks have been sent out. Any one finding mistakes will please send in their complaints as soon as possible so that they can be adjusted and corrected. After the corrections have been made the names will be sent to the papers.

There are a few students that need special mention for their high standing. The first place belongs to Mrs. Eshelman's student, Edward Sidlow, with an average grade of 94%. Two students have an average of 91%, Bertrand Arnold taught by Hubert Post, and Mildred Reif taught by Mildred Fey and Gesena Boom. Two students have an average of 90%, Nellie Musil taught by Mrs. Chapman and Karl Goth taught by Letha Hunsicker.

A good teacher is a splendid investment, her influence in a community cannot be estimated in dollars and cents; but she needs good willing students to work with and she needs hearty cooperation from the parents. With these three elements at their best the schools can do splendid work.

This year the students have done very good work generally, due largely to the directors choosing the teachers with care. It is the time for reelection. If a teacher has done good work, why change?

There is a long list of students averaging in the eighties that should be mentioned but for fear of doing injustice to others where mistakes may have been made, this list will appear later.

Two other students should be among the 90 list except that some of their grades are missing. They are Reba Bent taught by Mrs. Maysel Denton and Florence Bangert taught by Gladys Wilson. Florence Bangert has an average of 94% in the studies that she took.

The defeat of the Old Guard in Pennsylvania, following the defeat of the Old Guard in Indiana, helps to conform the fact that the Old Guard organization is breaking up in the states under the weight of the Old Guard administration at Washington. Alter was defeated for the nomination for governor of Pennsylvania because he represents the same element in the party and stands for the same policies that Harding stands for in the nation. Alter's defeat is a further confirmation of the fact known to most political observers that the people at large have had all they will stand of reactionism, inefficiency, incompetency and alliance with special privileges which is so flagrant and notorious that even on Old Guard stand-pat Republican state like Pennsylvania will not longer endure it.

The vote for Gifford Pinchot, as in the case of Beveridge of Indiana, was not a vote for any affirmative set of policies, but a vote of protest against the Republican national administration, and, incidentally a protest against the Harrisburg Contractor's ring in Pennsylvania. The Pinchot vote does not mean that all the men and women who voted for Mr. Pinchot in the primaries are going to vote for him at the polls. Thousands of them voted for him because they had no other means at this time of registering their protest against economic conditions brought on by the befuddled national administration. This element will be found behind the candidacy of John A. McSparren, the genuinely progressive Democratic nominee for Governor, when they cast their votes in November. They realize that Mr. Pinchot can only be elected by the support of the Old Guard, and that his election, brought about in such a way, would simply mean that he would be powerless to carry out most of the progressive policies that he may have. They realize also that John A. McSparren would be free from any such alliances and entanglements, and would owe his election only to the progressive citizenship of Pennsylvania, without regard of party.

There is no hope that the Republican party of Pennsylvania as a whole ever will or can become a progressive party. If Pennsylvania is to take her place in the list of progressive states, it must be under a Democratic state administration.

The net result of the Pennsylvania primaries is a repudiation of and a warning to a reactionary element now in control of the Republican party. It is noticed that the days of blundering, four-flushing normalcy are at an end, and that the grip of the reactionaries upon their party organization is broken. It is fair warning to the reactionaries also that the worst is yet to come.
