FARM BUREAU NOTES

(By Henry R. Fausch, County Agent)

According to a statement sent out by the Bureau of Livestock Industry, United States Department of Agriculture, Webster county ranks first in Nebraska and ninth in the United States in better livestock.

Following is a list of counties and their ranking: 1st Pulaska, Va. 2nd Hardin, Ohio, 3rd Greenville, S. C., 4th Kittitas, Wash., 5th Hancock, O., 6th Orange, Va., 7th Green, O., 8th Belmont, O., 9th Webster, Nebr., 10th Dodge, Nebr., 11th Stafford, Va., 12th Nance, Nebr., 13th Washington, O., 14th Cass, Nebr., 15th Cashoctor, O., 16th Brunswick, O., 17th Hampshire, Mass., 18th Morill, Nebr., 19th Oldham, Ky., 20th Pierce, Wis.

Webster county can feel proud of this position and has won this reputation not with a few big breeders, but with the large number of small breeders. Some counties are famous for their cattle, others for their hogs, but Webster county has both the cattle and hogs.

The Pure Bred Breeders in Webster county have increased 150% during the past five years and if the good work goes on, we will not have any trouble in retaining our high position.

This live stock improvement survey is based on the number of pure bred sires at the head of herds. Webster county will have to credit our calf and pig clubs for this position.

This year's club enrollment is as follows: Shorthorn Heifer 9, Holstein Heifers 4, Hereford Heifers 4, Jersey Heifers 2, Shorthorn Baby Beef 6, Poland China Sow and Litter 17, Duroc Jersey Sow and Litter 14. Club work started June 1st and will close October 1st.
