The agreement between this country and Great Britain that letters to England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales, will need only a two cent stamp instead of five cents, went into effect Thursday.

At present the new rate of postage applies only to the British Isles, but eventually it may be extended so as to include all of the British possessions, and it may be that in a few years one may send letters to South Africa or India for the same postage that is required for a letter to be delivered in one's home town. The remarkable reduction in rates was agreed upon between the two nations as the best means of promoting commercial and friendly relations between the United States and Great Britain, and it is quite certain that before long Germany, France and Italy will be asking for a similar arrangement with regard to letter mail in those countries. Postmaster General Meyer is entitled to most of the credit for the change.
