CAMPBELL CHURCH DESTROYED.

The Building Costs About Twelve Thousand Dollars.

CAMPBELL, Nebr., Jan 18—The large Catholic church at this place, together with the two-story residence adjoining, occupied by Fathers Sirois and Endibert, were totally destroyed by fire early Monday morning. The fire was discovered in the church at 1:40; and the department immediately responded to the call, but the flames had gained such headway that nothing from either church or house could be saved. A strong wind was blowing from the south, and as the church is situated on the hill south of the business part of town, the flying sparks and embers that were carried, a distance of four blocks, seriously menaced a great portion of the town. The church is of brick, valued at \$12,000, with \$7,000 insurance, while the residence was frame valued at \$1,500 with \$600 insurance. The altar first caught fire and it is supposed a candle had fallen and started the blaze. The church will be rebuilt as the parish is a large one.—State Journal.
