CAMPBELL CHURCH DESTROYED. The Building Costs About Twelve Thousand Dollars.

CAMPBELL, Nebr., Jan 18-The large Catholic church at this place, together with the two-story residence adjoining, oc upied by Fathers Sirois and Endibert, were totally destroyed by fire early Monday morning.
