## Mint "Makes Money" for Your Uncle Sam



THE director of the mint has "made money" for the United States in more ways than one. He is rejoicing of \$1,162,982 was recoined. because the government made a profit during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1908, of \$10,541,371 on the coinage of silver, nickel and one-cent bronze

pieces. This represents the difference between the price paid by the government for the metals and their coinage

The original deposits of gold bullion in the mints and assay offices during the fiscal year amounted to \$207,415,-984 and uncurrent United States gold coin of the face value of \$4,020,668 was received for recoinage.

Silver bullion purchased for subsidiary silver coinage during the year aggregated 18,819,279 standard ounces, and mutilated and uncurrent United States silver coin of the face value

The coinage executed by the mints during the fiscal year 1908 amounted to \$197,238,377 in gold, of which \$106,-182,420 were in double eagles, and \$4,-829,060 in eagles of the designs prepared by the American sulptor, the late Augustus Sain Gaudens.

The amount of subsidiary silver coin executed was \$16,530,477.
